



# MORE THAN CONQUERORS

## **This Week's Icebreaker Question:**

If you could visit any place you've never been, where would you go?

## **Series Questions:**

1. What has God revealed to you?
2. What are you doing about it?
3. How is it changing your life?

## **Sermon Specific Questions:**

1. Read Romans 8:31-34 and John 8:10-11. These verses in Romans mark the beginning of Paul's closing remarks regarding the case he's been making not only in Romans chapter 8 but the entirety of the book of Romans up to this point. Each verse asks a question that points to the greatness of God and the finality of His work in our lives. One writer noted, "Paul is writing in confident praise!" Believers can and should live in a state of "confident praise" because we know what God has done and is doing in us. What do you need to praise God for right now? Are there areas of life where you have forgotten to walk in "confident praise?"
2. Read Romans 8:31-39. Read through the two lists that Paul makes for us in verses 35 and 38-39 and think of the word or situation you fear the most. How do the questions that Paul asks in verses 31-34 give us the confidence to face these situations/fears with confidence? How do we properly apply the Word of God to our lives in a way that will reinforce our faith in Christ and His provision!
3. Read Romans 8:33-39. The word sovereignty is defined as, "supreme power or authority." What does it mean to say that God is sovereign? How is he in control and how do we see His sovereignty played out through the end of Romans chapter 8?
4. Read Romans 8:35-39. Paul makes it a point to support his assertion about God's love using theology as well as personal experience. What is your experience regarding "the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord?" In hindsight, how have you seen God at work through your suffering and hardships? If you had to describe "the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" to another person, how would you describe it?
5. In verse 36, right after asking the rhetorical question of what can separate us from the love of Christ, Paul quotes Psalm 44:22. Read Psalm 44. How does Psalm 44 relate to Paul's point? How does the Psalm convey the same hopeful message as Paul?
