Sermon Specific Questions:

1. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 and Revelation 21:4 - How does the knowledge of Christ's return, and the promised end of death, mourning and pain, affect the way we respond to the death of those close to us? How might it change how we look at our death?
2. Read 2 Peter 3:8-10. How does Peter respond to those who scoff at the return of Christ and what seems to be his delay in his coming? What is the central premise for God's patience in returning and how should that affect us and challenge us as believers?
3. Read Hebrews 10:24-25. The writer of Hebrews speaks of the "Day" drawing near in reference to the Day of the Lord or his return. In light of the Day of the Lord, why is it so crucial that believers meet together and encourage one another? How can you encourage and stir up those close to you in love and good works as Hebrews states?
4. The Bible teaches there will be a seven-year time of judgment known as the tribulation. Why do you think God draws this out? What does it say about God's heart for people to turn to Him?
5. Read 1 Thessalonians 5:6-8. If today was your last day, who would you talk to? What conversations would you have? What does 1 Thessalonians say about how we should live until the coming of the Lord?
