



This Week's Icebreaker Question:

What team are you rooting for in the Superbowl (Rams or Patriots)?

Series Questions:

1. What has God revealed to you?
2. What are you doing about it?

Sermon Specific Questions:

1. Read Psalm 139:13-16. Many pro-choice advocates try to frame abortion as a right to choose or women's rights because they don't like to view it as killing unborn babies. What does this scripture have to say specifically about a baby in their mother's womb? What does this scripture tell us about God's care for the unborn and how He views them?
2. Read Genesis 48:8-16 – The Bible speaks a lot about one's descendants. God promises Abraham to make of him a great nation and that promise is passed on to Isaac, Jacob, etc. "Sons are a heritage from the Lord, children a reward from Him," writes the Psalmist in Psalm 127:3. Have you experienced abortion personally? Has someone close to you chosen to abort a child? How has that affected your family generations? Does it have lingering effects?
3. Read Jeremiah 1:5. God is omniscient, meaning that he is all-knowing and that he knows about each of us even before we were born. What does this scripture speak to us concerning life and God's plans for a child even before they are even known about by their parents? What would it look like for us to view each life as God does?
4. Read Genesis 1:27. What does it mean that God has created human beings in His image? How should the fact that we are image bearers of God influence our thinking when it comes to the issue of abortion? What can you do to help people understand God's view of how he created every human life?
5. What should the Christians response be to a woman or couple that has had an abortion? What should the church's response be? How does Jesus respond to those in the Bible that has made a mistake? How can we model Christ to a hurting world and hurting people?
