



This Week's Icebreaker Question:

If you could be cast in a movie of your choice, what movie would you choose and which character would you want to play?

Series Questions:

1. What has God revealed to you?
2. What are you doing about it?
3. How is it changing your life?

Sermon Specific Questions:

1. Read Romans 12:3 and 1 Peter 4:10. Why does Paul encourage us to “think with sober judgment” about ourselves before discussing differing gifts among believers who belong to one body? How can people tend to view others with different backgrounds and abilities? How does being a member of the Body of Christ change how we view our giftings and those of others?
2. Read Romans 12:3-8. Pastor Tim Keller asks three great questions related to this passage about giftings: How have these verses changed the way you think of yourself? How have they changed the way you view your church? How will they change the way in which you use your gifts in and for your church?
3. Read Romans 12:3 and 1 Peter 5:5. Why do you think that Paul exhorts believers “not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think?” What is the connection between humility and service to others by the grace of God? How can you continue to grow in humility, especially in terms of the areas that God has gifted you?
4. Read Romans 12:3. In Romans 12:1-2, we are urged by Paul to “offer our bodies as a living sacrifice.” How does the context of these first two verses of Romans 12 influence how we live out 12:3-8? How have you personally used your giftings that God has given you by his grace as an act of worship? Share an example of how God has used you in your gifting as you have offered it back to Him.
5. Read Romans 12:4-5 and 1 Corinthians 12:14-27. In both passages, Paul refers to the church as the body of Christ and compares it to the functioning of the human body. What is significant from these passages about how the body of Christ is supposed to operate? How does Paul compare both the unity and diversity of the body of Christ? How do you guard against comparison in terms of wishing you had another gifting that belonged to another member of the body?
