



**This Week's Icebreaker Question:**

If you could live in any period of history when would it be and why?

**Series Questions:**

1. What has God revealed to you?
2. What are you doing about it?
3. How is it changing your life?

**Sermon Specific Questions:**

1. Read Romans 13:8-10 and Exodus 20:1-17. What is the point Paul is making by listing the commandments in verses 9-10 of Romans 13? In your own words, rephrase the concept Paul is conveying in these verses?

2. Read Romans 13:11-12, Ephesians 5:1-16 and 1 Thessalonians 5:6. In all these passages, Paul tells God's people to awaken, to put aside things of darkness and instead live in the light. Are you fully awake? Are you living under His full control? Are there areas of your life that you would define as "darkness" that you know you should put aside?

3. Read Romans 13:14 and 1 Peter 2:21. Paul exhorts us to, "put on the Lord Jesus Christ," and Peter tells us that Christ, "left us an example." What do you think it means to be clothed with Christ? How do we best follow the example left for us by Jesus?

4. Read Romans 13:8-10. Unlike normal debts which we can pay up fully and be done with, love is an unlimited debt which we can never be done paying off. Honor is the same way, it is a debt that is owed, paid, and is still owed! What can we as believers do to live a life that shows honor to others continually and pays our debts as an act of love?

5. Read Romans 13:11-12. Pastor David talked about the urgency of our time and how that should change how we love others. He pointed out that our present time is not just a dark place with only darkness and evil, but it is also a positive time, when, "night is gone and day has come!" What have you seen around you recently that points to the fact that for the Christian, this time we live in is a time of hope?
