Athletic team logos of colleges and universities are trademarks and as such cannot be legally copied without the express written permission of the license. A company or person who wishes to use university sports logos for goods must first obtain official permission from the proper authorities. The governing body of the college or university licensing programme varies from one agency to another. To identify licensing authorities, contact universities of interest first. Some schools have internal programs to license the brand. For example, The Iowa Hawkeye Athletics Department refers to interested applicants in the University of Iowa Licensing Program. Other higher education institutions refer the interested party outside the site to a representative body, such as the Collegiate Licensing Company, which manages the marketing and licensing of university brands for about 200 institutions. The CLC is working on the application process for the schools submitted and makes recommendations on the basis of the information received. However, each college or university shall decide whether to approve the licensing proposal. The universities of Alabama, Arizona, California, Connecticut, Duke, Florida and Florida State, Georgia, Louisville, Michigan, Nebraska, North Carolina, Texas Tech and Wisconsin are among the schools CLC represents. In order to obtain a university trade mark licence represented by the CLC, the applicant must choose between four types of licences. Local businesses who wish to sell products only in the home country of a university or college can apply for a local license through clc. First-time applicants are limited to three schools in the same country. After initial approval, applicants will receive licences for up to five universities and colleges in the country. Internal Campus Vendor License is for companies that sell products back to departments at a particular university. It does not include alumni or student groups and, according to the CLC, these types of license mandates narrow distribution restrictions. Clc offers special licenses for events such as bowl games and permits to use NCAA or specific conference trademarks with or without university logos. Standard CLC licenses are intended for companies that demonstrate extensive marketing plans and intend to distribute products across the region. It is the most expensive and difficult university sports logo license to obtain, according to the CLC. However, the company argues that companies that submit detailed applications for well-thought-out marketing plans are most likely to succeed in acquiring a license for university sports logos. Iowa State recognizes first-year students based on a formula that takes into account each applicant's ACT score, percentage grade in high school, GPA and high school transcripts. The school also accepts candidates for GED or high school equivalent exams. Iowa State University's admission rate for undergraduates is about 89%. Transfer applicants with at least 24 transferable substances from accredited school and GPA of at least 2.25 receive guaranteed admissions. Candidates who meet GPA requirements but have 24 credits cannot earn automatic admission. Candidates with fewer than 24 credits must meet GPA standards with all rookie admission requirements. University applicants must submit bachelor's reports and show 3.0 GPA or higher. Candidates with lower public contracts may be temporarily accepted. While the school does not require students to submit postgraduate entrance exams, some specific programs require GRE grades. The students come from all 99 Iowa counties, all 50 states and 126 different states. The school boasts a 19:1 faculty-to-student ratio. In 2009, the extension and renovation of the library was completed. Thompson's library is the largest in the state's university system and has places for 1,800 students to study. Located on the 11th floor, the reading room offers impressive views of the campus and Columbus, and the main reading room on the second floor overlooks the Oval. There is also a café in the Thompson Hotel's library, wireless internet access, hundreds of public computers, quiet reading rooms and, of course, extensive electronic and printable businesses. English is the most popular humanities major at Ohio State University (followed by history), and in the 2008-09 academic year, 279 students completed their bachelor's degrees in English. OSU also has master's and doctoral programs in English. Denney Hall is also the office of Arts and Sciences Consulting and Academic Services. Like many major universities, OSU academic counseling is handled through centralized offices equipped with full-time professional counselors (in smaller colleges, faculty counselors are more common). The Bureau deals with issues relating to registration, timing, general education requirements, larger and smaller requirements and graduation requirements. The thirteen-storey building, as in many living spaces, has a weight space, wireless internet access, cable, kitchen, study rooms, bicycle space, air conditioning and other amenities. Ohio State has living and learning communities, and Taylor Tower is home to learning communities affiliated with honors, Business Honors and allies of diversity. All university dwellings have quiet classes that go from 9 a.m. to 7 a.m. from Sunday to Thursday.
