



PROFILE 2020-21

Type of School: Loyola High School of Los Angeles, founded in 1865, is an all-male, four-year, Catholic college preparatory school conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Typically, 99% of graduates go directly to higher education, 96% to four-year colleges. Current enrollment is 1270 including a senior class of 294.

Faculty: Loyola's 120 faculty members, counselors, and administrative staff all hold professional degrees, including 12 at the doctoral level, and 90 at the masters level.

Accreditation and Memberships: Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Western Catholic Educational Association, Jesuit Schools Network, National Catholic Education Association, the College Board, NACAC, WACAC.

School Community: Loyola is located in central Los Angeles and draws students from every area in the city and suburbs. Admission is by entrance examination, recommendations, and elementary school grades. Typically, 125 elementary schools are represented in a freshman class drawn from an applicant pool representing over 240 schools. Approximately 48% of those who apply are enrolled. Loyola's tuition in 2020-21 is \$21,825. Some 46% of the students are Latino, African-American, Asian, or Filipino. First generation college applicants comprise 16.8% of Loyola's student body.

Curriculum: The basic program required of all students includes eight semesters of English and Theology; six of Mathematics, Foreign Language, Science, and Social Science; and two semesters of Fine Arts and Health/PE. 135 hours of community service are also a requirement for graduation.

Honors Level Courses Available to Class of 2021: With the exception of AP World History in sophomore year, *students do not have open access to honors and AP classes* since admissions into these courses are based on previous academic performance.
