ARCADIA, CALIFORNIA

Collaboration and accessibility were at the center of the vision for this 36,700-square-foot education center east of Los Angeles. The Arcadia Unified School District wanted to relocate its main offices and find new ways to serve 4,000 K-12 students.

The \$12.7 million alternative education center became the public face of the district to the community, offering local employers the chance to connect with students in a high-level, collegiate-style environment. Located adjacent to the future Gold Line rail expansion, the project capitalized on a park-adjacent space to turn the center into a hub for the community as the area continues to grow. The building is home to a variety of unconventional collaboration spaces, including conference style teaching rooms, flex desks outside classrooms and open-air spaces for interactive programming. The integrated design allows students across grades and disciplines to interact in ways not normally found in large school districts.
