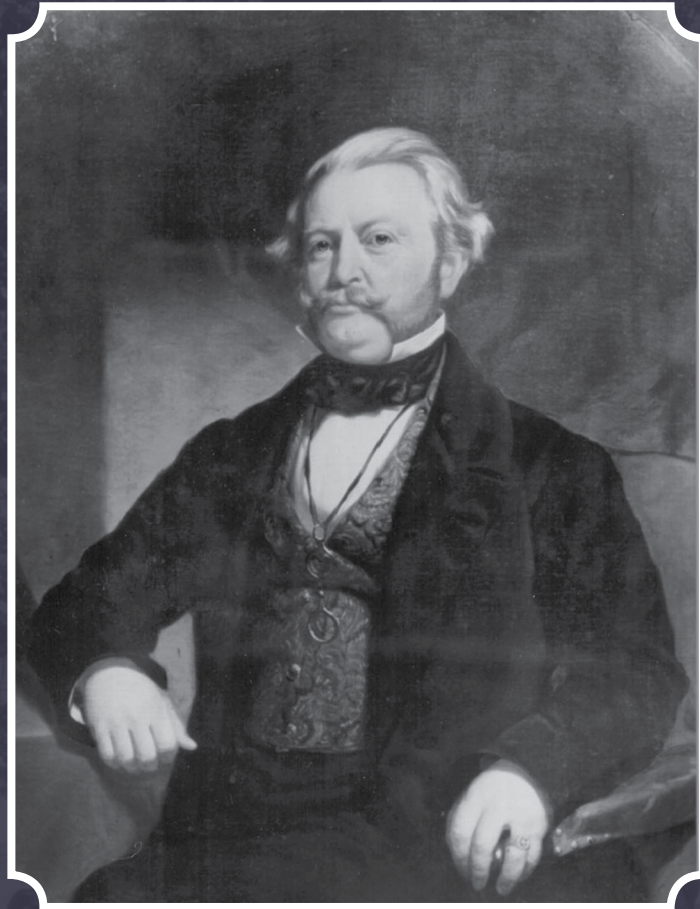

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDALISTS



This award medal is named after the founder of the City College of New York, Townsend Harris. Established in 1933 by a gift from the Class of 1906, Townsend Harris Medals are awarded each year at the Alumni Association's Annual Alumni Dinner to not more than seven alumni for outstanding postgraduate achievement in their chosen fields. Candidates are selected, from nominations, by a special committee comprised of former recipients of the medal and subject to final approval by the Alumni Association Board of Directors.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

DR. JOSEPH ABATE '61



Joseph Abate was born and raised in Ozone Park, Queens, the youngest child of Italian immigrants and the first born in this country. He was a member of the CCNY Alumni Association for the first decade following graduation; this was still true even while Joe was earning a PhD from New York University (Courant Institute, 1967), an achievement noted in *The City College Alumnus* issue from October 1967. That same entry indicates that he was working at the time for Computer Applications Incorporated, a medium-size software firm that included a new department engaged in the design of online systems. The head of the Systems Design Division was Harvey Dubner, who in later years distinguished himself by finding special form prime numbers such as repunit and Fibonacci primes. It was when working with Harvey at CAI that Joe co-developed the

Ticketron system, “a successfully operating system without an operating system” Joe and Harvey went on to coauthor five papers on system analysis projects.

The 1970s found Joe working for Bell Laboratories at their Whippany, NJ facility, where many of his work peers were also CCNY alumni. Joe’s first project involved a large military project for the US Army’s anti-ballistic missile (ABM) system Safeguard Program; it was not long before he switched over to telephony work. For the next decade, Joe worked on the analysis of transaction processing systems used in support of telephone company operations. It was at Bell Laboratories where he found another writing partner, Ward Whitt, an expert on stochastic service systems. Ward’s expertise complemented Joe’s queueing system prowess, and together they published almost 40 papers primarily focused on exact and approximate methods to describe the transient behavior of queues, and numerical transform inversion.

One notable highlight from Joe and Ward’s impressive publication record is their 2006 paper that provides a unique perspective on methods for inverting Laplace Transforms. The paper was published in the *INFORMS Journal on Computing*, and 14 years later, it earned the 2020 “Test of Time Award” from the journal’s editors in recognition for being the most cited paper of those published in *INFORMS* from 2002-2006. The editors lauded it as an invaluable resource for “researchers who use it as a springboard for new methods” in the field of Laplace Transforms and numerical transform inversion. Dr. Abate’s groundbreaking accomplishments in the field of queueing theory and Laplace Transforms, and his invaluable contributions to the projects he worked on for decades at Bell Laboratories, continue to keep him connected to his first and most important alumni association.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

BERNARD ADLER, P.E. '62EE



Bernard Adler, PE has dedicated over 60 years to the profession of transportation planning and traffic engineering. After graduating from the School of Engineering at the City College of New York, Mr. Adler worked at the AIL Division of Cutler Hammer, Computran Systems Corporation, the Tri-State Regional Planning Commission, Wilbur Smith & Associates, and Raymond Keyes Associates. In 1979, Mr. Adler was appointed Commissioner of Traffic for the City of White Plains, New York where he implemented many innovative programs, including New York State's first computerized network traffic control system; created a program for large overhead street name signs, prepared energy conservation programs, and a fire preferential routing system; managed the design, installation, maintenance and operation of all traffic control devices for the control of pedestrian and vehicular traffic including signs, signals and pavement markings; coordinated with other planning agencies of White Plains on matters of traffic and transportation needs of the present and future; and advised the Mayor, Common Council and other agencies of the government on the City's traffic requirements regarding the welfare of the public with respect to traffic.

In 1991, Mr. Adler founded Adler Consulting, Transportation Planning & Traffic Engineering and amplified his well-known name in the transportation and traffic field of Westchester County, New York. As President of Adler Consulting, Mr. Adler served the public and private sectors in the area of transportation supported by his many years of professional expertise. Mr. Adler personally reviewed analyses and appeared before governmental agencies supporting the findings and conclusions of studies conducted by the firm. Mr. Adler also furthered his devotion to transportation planning by being an Adjunct Professor of Civil Engineering at Manhattan College where he focused on Transportation Planning.

Mr. Adler's contributions to the profession over the years have included being a Fellow at the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE), a Member of the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE), a Past Member of the Transportation Research Board, and a member of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers. Mr. Adler served ITE's Metropolitan Section of NY/NJ as President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary, as well as on many of its committees and was Director of ITE's District One. Mr. Adler also served as International Director of ITE and, last but certainly not least, held offices of President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary of the Alumni Association of the City College of New York's Engineering School Alumni Society.

Mr. Adler is the recipient of the Leon Goodman Distinguished Member Award, the Ivor S. Wispart Engineer of the Year Award and the Harvey Boutwell Distinguished Service Award from the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE). Mr. Adler was named Outstanding Engineer in Government by the Westchester County Chapter of the National Society of Professional Engineers and received the Alumni Service Award from the City College of New York Alumni Association.

Today, Mr. Adler is part of LaBella Associates, where he is a Senior Transportation Consultant. As a licensed Professional Engineer in New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut, Mr. Adler has worked with clients in government, real estate, healthcare and education as well as, religious, and cultural institutions for in both the public and private sectors.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

DR. TRACI BURGESS '89



Traci Burgess, MD MPH CPE is a Maternal-Fetal Medicine specialist practicing in Bergen County, NJ at the Valley Hospital. She is currently the Director of Perinatology.

Born and raised in NYC, she attended The Bronx High School of Science prior to her admission to the Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education, at The City College of New York.

She is a graduate of SUNY Downstate in Brooklyn and she trained at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center for her residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology. She then pursued fellowship training in Maternal Fetal Medicine at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center and a Masters in Public Health at the Mailman School

of Public Health of Columbia University.

Post training, she worked for 15 years in Brooklyn, NY serving a very diverse population, teaching and training medical students and residents, as well as being very involved with administrative and health policy aspects of medicine. While there she developed an interest in patient safety and completed a Patient Safety Fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University.

Since 2011 she has been working in New Jersey at the Valley Hospital, where she is presently the Director of the Center for Maternal Fetal Medicine. She is excited to resume teaching when the Valley Hospital starts its new residency program and graduate medical education in July 2024.

Professionally she has been active with the National Medical Association, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the Society of Maternal Fetal Medicine. She is a member of many other medical and professional organizations with various levels of local and national involvement over the years.

She is a strong supporter of community education and engagement in health and actively works to create a medically diverse workforce. More recently she has done this through involvement with mentoring programs.

While Dr. Burgess finds work fulfilling her biggest satisfaction is derived from being a mother, daughter, sister, niece and friend. Her most important job is being mother to a young son who she loves dearly and who unknowingly has become her muse.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

ALBERT V. DE LEON '72



Albert V. De Leon received his BA from The City College of New York, where he was editor of the student publication, *The Paper*, and a member of CCNY's then Division 1 baseball team. Mr. De Leon then received his JD from the University of San Diego School of Law where he was Far West Regional Director of the Black American Law Students Association, *Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges*, and later a member of its Alumni Board.

Mr. De Leon is a member of the New York Bar, serving in the U.S. Supreme Court, and the Southern & Eastern District Courts of New York. He is a Legal & Compliance consultant with extensive experience as a Senior Manager and Chief Legal/Compliance Officer with leading financial services institutions. He has advised companies on US legal, regulatory, and corporate strategy, managed turnarounds of in-crisis financial institutions, and has developed risk-based legal & compliance and ethics programs. De Leon's expertise covers bank/insurance regulatory, supervisory and compliance matters, particularly in the areas of financial crime (bank secrecy, anti-money laundering and foreign corruption), privacy, ethics, crisis management, business continuity, and corporate governance matters.

Mr. De Leon was previously Head of Compliance Advisory, Monitoring, & Remediation for Zurich North America, with oversight responsibilities for Zurich entities in North America; Senior Vice President & General Counsel for the French-Belgium Dexia Credit Local NY Agency and Dexia Bank-New York Branch, responsible for US legal, regulatory and compliance matters; General Counsel & Secretary and interim Branch Manager for the Swedish bank, Skandinaviska Enskilda Banken New York. At both banks he developed and managed the U.S. Legal & Compliance Departments, helping each to overcome Federal & State regulatory sanctions. Mr. De Leon started his banking career with National Westminster Bancorp Inc. (now Bank of America) where as Vice President & Counsel he managed the financial crimes program. He also designed a community development program that resulted in the bank receiving the first "outstanding" rating given by the US Comptroller of the Currency.

Mr. De Leon serves on the board of The National Jazz Museum in Harlem. He recently stepped down from the board of the NYC Industrial Development Corporation & Build NYC, and has served on the board of Newark Public Radio (jazz station WBGO), and Harlem-Dowling-West Side Center for Children & Family Services. He is an adviser and lecturer at the Pace University Center for Global Governance, Reporting and Regulation. Mr. De Leon has worked with the Financial Services Volunteer Corps in conducting education and training sessions for bankers, regulators, and compliance officers who combat financial crimes in Tunisia, Albania, Kenya and Russia.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

VIVIAN GORNICK '57



Vivian Gornick was born on June 14, 1935, in the Bronx, the youngest of Louis and Bess Gornick's two children. Her Ukrainian-born parents were working-class immigrants who met and married in New York. Her father worked as a presser in a dress factory for thirty years, and her mother was a bookkeeper and office clerk.

Ms. Gornick had known from a very young age that she wanted to write. She is now a published writer, journalist, essayist, and memoirist. In 1957 Gornick received a Bachelor of Arts degree from City College of New York and in 1960 a Master of Arts degree from New York University. Gornick moved to California to pursue a PhD at Berkeley. Gornick left Berkeley and returned to the East Coast and taught English at the State University of New York at Stony Brook in 1966-1967 and at Hunter College in 1967-1968, she worked as a reporter for the *Village Voice* from 1969 to 1977, while also writing for publications such as *The Nation*, *The New York Times*, and the *Atlantic*. As a staff writer for the *Village Voice* during the early 1970s, Gornick reported on the explosion of American feminist consciousness through the prism of her own experience, with her willingness to use her own life experiences to tell a larger social story becoming the hallmark of her writing..

Gornick has published eleven books; the most recent, *The Odd Woman and the City*, was published in May, 2015. Among her best-known works are the memoir *Fierce Attachments* and the essay collections *The End of the Novel of Love* and *Unfinished Business*.

Since leaving the *Village Voice*, she has divided her time between freelance writing and teaching in creative writing at The New School. For the 2007-2008 academic year, she was a fellow at the Radcliffe Institute at Harvard University, and in 2015 she served as the Bedell Distinguished Visiting Professor in the University of Iowa's Nonfiction Writing Program.

Gornick's career as a writer and essayist continues to flourish in the twenty-first century. Republication of some of her earlier works, such as *Women in Science* (with new entries), *Taking a Long Look* (2021; an anthology of previously published essays), and *The Romance of American Communism* (1977/2020), has enabled her to reach a new and younger audience. In March 2021 Gornick was awarded the Windham-Campbell Literature Prize for nonfiction.

Ms. Gornick has traveled widely, and lived abroad as well as in the American West and Southwest but New York is the only place in the world where she experiences a general sense of well-being. In fact, now, she says she could quite happily never leave the city again. It is a thrill for her to be honored by her alma mater, CCNY, where it all began.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

DR. ERIC SIN-KAM POON '76



Dr. Eric Sin-Kam Poon came to New York in 1970 at the age of 20. He worked in restaurants during his lunch hour and attended City College in the evening, majoring in biochemistry. After graduating from CCNY in 1976, he studied medicine at Mexico's Universidad La Salle. After a residency in Pediatrics at Long Island College hospital, he went on to finish a fellowship in Pediatric Cardiology at New York Hospital, Weill Cornell University Medical college.

Dr. Poon has worked in both hospital academic medicine and private practice within the Chinese communities. He started his private practice in 1988 and that same year served as the attending Pediatric Cardiologist at Brookdale Hospital in Brooklyn, NY. Dr Poon served as the Chief of Pediatrics at the New York Downtown Hospital from 1992 to 2013.

After making the observation that Chinese immigrants do not go to visit doctors or hospitals, Dr Poon, along with a group of colleagues, initiated the Chinese Community Partnership Program, with the mission to bring the hospital to the community. The Chinese Community Partnership Program has served over 200 000 patients over the past 30 years, having a notable impact in decreasing morbidity and mortality related to diabetes, strokes and heart attacks, within communities.

In 1999, Dr. Poon was awarded the Caring for Children Award by the Coalition for Asian Americans, as well as the Community Service Awards by both the New York City Comptroller's Office and the Chinese American Medical Society in 1996 and 2006, respectively. He was also awarded a Distinguished Physician Award by New York Downtown Hospital in 2012 and a Physician Award by the New York-Presbyterian-Lower Manhattan Hospital in 2014.

Dr. Poon currently serves as the Director of Community Liaison at New York-Presbyterian Lower Manhattan Hospital and as the Chairman of the Chinese Community Partnership for Health.

2023 TOWNSEND HARRIS MEDAL

JOBLIN CHRISTOPHER YOUNGER, ESQ. '05



Joblin C. Younger, Esq., LL.M., a native of Massachusetts, earned his Bachelor of Arts (Political Science) in 2005 (Magna Cum Laude) from CCNY. While at CCNY, Attorney Younger was a Mentor in the CCNY Mentor Program, and a Fellow of the then D’Agostino-Greenberg Program, Colin Powell Center, and Rosenberg-Humphrey Program. He interned on Capitol Hill for Rep. Charlie Rangel, and at graduation, was awarded the Kupferman Juvenile Justice Award.

After graduation, he returned to Massachusetts, started law school, and engaged in the community with several LGBTQIA+ organizations, including as a Commissioner of the Governor’s Commission on Gay and Lesbian Youth.

During his studies at Suffolk University Law School in the evening division—as he worked full-time—he served in the Student Bar Association and was an editor of a law school publication. Outside of law school he served on the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts LGBTQ Bar Association and clerked for the Honorable David A. Mills of the Massachusetts Appeals Court. After graduating law school, he attended the Boston University School of Law and earned his LL.M. (Taxation).

Attorney Younger maintains his community engagement on several fronts; his LGBTQIA+ engagement included service with Fenway Community Health Center, Inc. (Fenway) and AIDS Action Committee, where he served as Board Clerk and Chair of the Audit Committee. He founded Fenway’s Young Leaders Council (YLC), captained Team YLC for Harbor to the Bay (a one-day 126-mile bicycle ride from Boston to Provincetown) and co-chaired the Men’s Event (Fenway’s annual gala).

At the Massachusetts Bar Association (MBA), he served for many years on the MBA’s Probate Council, and Amicus Curiae and Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committees, and the MBA’s Leadership Academy. He frequently lectures for the MBA, Boston Bar Association, Massachusetts Continuing Legal Education, Massachusetts Black Lawyers Association, Committee for Public Counsel Services, and Boston Tax Institute, among others.

Attorney Younger maintains his own private practice (trusts and estates) and is licensed in Massachusetts, New York, Supreme Court of the United States, United States Tax Court, and United States District Court for Massachusetts. He is a gubernatorial appointee (confirmed by the Governor’s Council) as a Public Administrator (Suffolk County in 2013 and 2018, and Essex County in 2022).

Attorney Younger is currently working with the Probate & Family Court of the Trial Court to promulgate standards for Guardians-Ad-Litem (“GAL”; GALs serve to represent the interests of minors, persons unknown or unascertained, and persons missing or incapacitated in matters brought before the Court). He conducts a free legal clinic for the Beverly (MA) Council on Aging, and the MBA’s Dial-A-Lawyer program, and serves on the Board of Advisors for Harborlight Homes, Inc. a non-profit providing affordable housing for elders and low-income individuals.

THE 2023 JOHN H. FINLEY AWARD

DAVID JONES AND THE COMMUNITY SERVICE SOCIETY



David R. Jones, Esq. is President and Chief Executive Officer of the Community Service Society of New York (CSS), a nonpartisan, not-for-profit organization that promotes economic advancement and full civic participation for low-income New Yorkers. Mr. Jones, an outspoken advocate for low-income New Yorkers, writes a bi-weekly newspaper column in the New York Amsterdam News that serves to educate the public and government officials on issues of importance to minority and underserved communities.

Mr. Jones has led CSS since 1986. From 1983 to 1986, he served as Executive Director of the New York City Youth Bureau. Mr. Jones was Special Advisor to Mayor Koch from 1979 to 1983 with responsibilities in race relations, urban development, immigration reform, and education. Prior to his nonprofit and public service careers, he specialized in corporate antitrust cases and contract litigation at the law firm of Cravath, Swaine & Moore.

A highly respected New York City leader on issues of urban poverty and economic advancement, Mr. Jones has served on transition committees for former New York City Mayor Bill de Blasio, former Mayor Michael Bloomberg and former New York State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman. He also served as a member of the Moreland Commission. In June 2016, the State Senate confirmed Mr. Jones to fill a city seat on the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA).

From 1996 to 2000, Mr. Jones was Chairman of the Board of Carver Federal Savings Bank, the largest African American managed bank in the nation. He served for 12 years on the board of trustees of Wesleyan University and is now a Trustee Emeritus. Mr. Jones also served on the board of the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation and was Vice Chairman of the Primary Care Development Corporation, which finances health care programs and facilities in medically underserved communities. Mr. Jones is the former Chairman of the Board of Type Media Center (formerly The Nation Institute).

Mr. Jones is past chair of the National Committee for Responsive Philanthropy, which is committed to making organized philanthropy more responsive to socially, economically, and politically disenfranchised people. He is a founding member of the Upper Manhattan Empowerment Zone and for seven years was President of Black Agency Executives, a group of Black leaders of major New York City human service agencies. For over 10 years he served as a member of the board of directors of the Puerto Rican Legal Defense and Education Fund.

While studying for his Bachelor of Arts degree from Wesleyan University, Mr. Jones interned in the Washington D.C. office of New York Senator Robert F. Kennedy. He received a Juris Doctor degree from the Yale Law School in 1974, afterwards clerking for Judge Constance Baker Motley of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York. Mr. Jones was a recipient of the Thomas J. Watson Fellowship. Among his many awards is an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from the City University of New York.

Born in the Bedford-Stuyvesant community of Brooklyn, Mr. Jones is the son of the late State Assemblymember and Judge Thomas R. Jones.

He is married to Dr. Valerie King, a clinical psychologist. They have two children. Mr. Jones is a member of the New York State and Federal Bars.

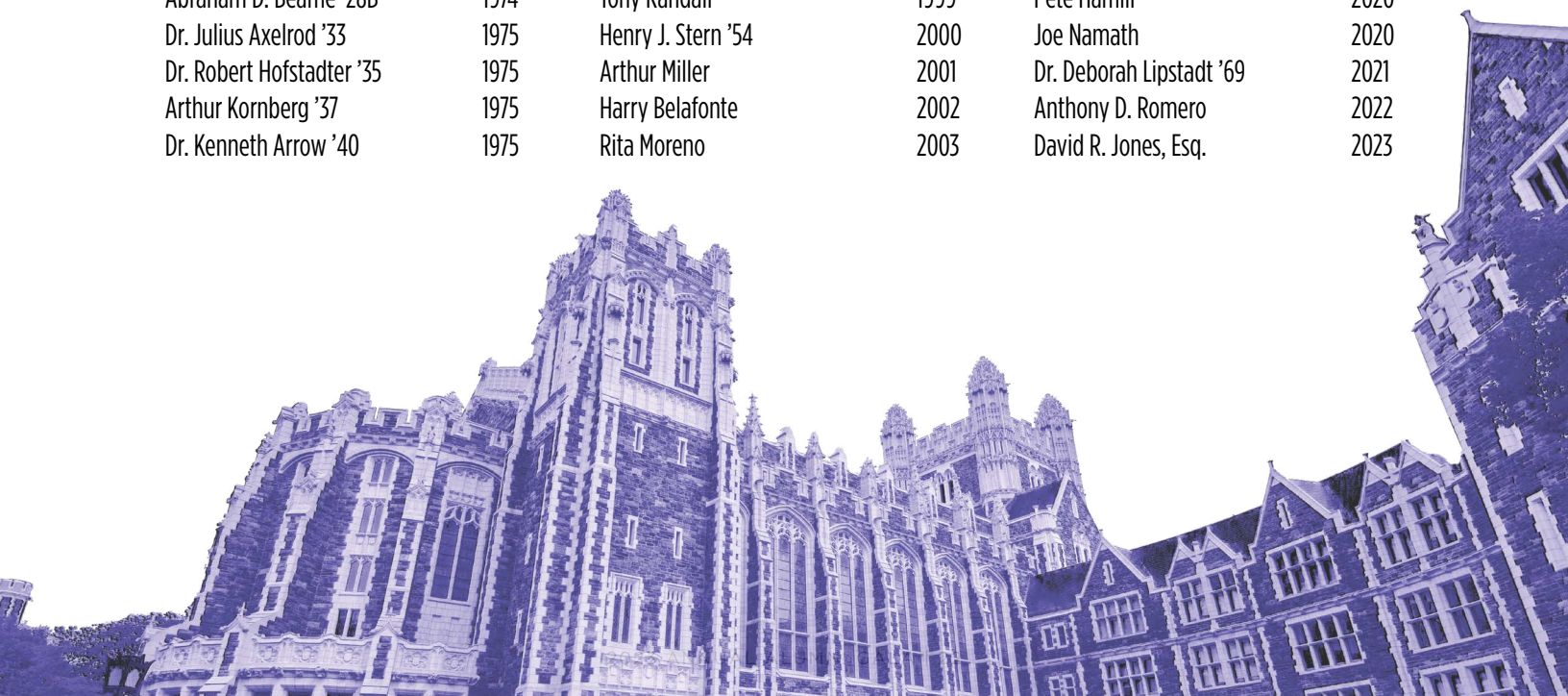

TONY LISS

CCNY Provost



Dr. Tony M. Liss, an internationally known physicist with research experience at the world's highest energy accelerators, is The City College of New York's provost. Dr. Liss had served as provost and senior vice president for academic affairs since March 2018.

Provost Liss continues to help lead the 176-year-old CCNY that is now classified in the "Doctoral Universities: High Research" category by The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education[®]. The Carnegie Classification has been the leading framework for recognizing and describing institutional diversity in U.S. higher education for the past four and a half decades.

Dr. Liss joined CCNY in the fall of 2013 as the first Martin and Michele Cohen Dean of Science. During his tenure as Dean, he reinforced the Division of Science's five departments with dynamic research-active faculty; oversaw the opening of a new complex of science buildings on CCNY's South Campus, and tirelessly championed faculty, student, and staff success.

Before coming to CCNY, Dr. Liss was a professor of physics at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, whose faculty he joined in 1988.

Globally, Dr. Liss is renowned for his research in high-energy physics at the world's highest-energy accelerators, including the Large Hadron Collider at CERN and the Collider Detector at Fermilab (CDF). He led groundbreaking research that resulted in the discovery of a new fundamental particle, the top quark, and he is a member of the ATLAS Collaboration that co-discovered the Higgs Boson in 2012.

A fellow of the American Physical Society, Provost Liss earned his Ph.D. in physics from the University of California - Berkeley in 1984 and holds a BA in physics from The Johns Hopkins University.

He is a member of the New York Academy of Sciences and serves on the boards of the New York Structural Biology Center and Science and Arts Engagement New York.

LAWRENCE GREENGRASS '73

President, Alumni Association of CCNY



Lawrence (Larry) Greengrass, who grew up in the Bronx as the son of two Holocaust survivors, is an attorney who is well known in the insurance and reinsurance community, having retired after spending more than forty years at the leading law firm of Mound Cotton Wollan & Greengrass with offices in New York and around the country. During his time with the firm, he represented insurance companies, reinsurance companies, brokers, intermediaries, and managing general agents in numerous complex arbitrations and litigations. Since his retirement from the firm, he continues to handle disputes between insurance and reinsurance companies, as an arbitrator. He is a former officer of a Bermuda reinsurance company and is certified as an arbitrator by ARIAS-U.S., the leading national professional association of reinsurance arbitrators.

Mr. Greengrass' legal and arbitration practice encompasses a wide range of subjects involving the property/casualty, life/accident, and health aspects of the insurance and reinsurance industry. He has handled more than 250 reinsurance arbitrations and has also handled legal cases in state and federal courts throughout the United States, Bermuda, and the United Kingdom.

Mr. Greengrass has been admitted to practice in the United States Courts of Appeals for the First, Second, Third, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth and Ninth Circuits covering most of the U.S. He also has been a certified continuing education instructor at The St. John's School of Risk Management, Insurance and Actuarial Science.

DR. ALLEN HERSHKOWITZ '78

Host



Dr. Allen Hershkowitz is an environmental scientist, visionary, activist, writer, lecturer and strategic sustainability advisor. For 26 years (1988 - 2016) he served as a Senior Scientist at the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) and was the force behind some of the organization's most effective and visible initiatives. Blending technical expertise with the influence of iconic cultural sectors, Dr. Hershkowitz leverages the cultural and market influence of sports and entertainment organizations to promote environmental literacy to mass audiences and corporate leaders alike. He has guided the sustainability programs of numerous American icons in professional sports, the entertainment sector and major corporations including the NBA, NHL, NASCAR, MLB, MLS, ESPN, HBO, Disney, AMC, the Warner Music Group, DuPont, Disney, Pepsi, Coca-Cola, Citizen Group, among others.

His leadership in helping sports organizations establish environmental programs earned his work the U.S. EPA's Environmental Merit Award in 2008 and 2015. In December 2015 Sports Business Journal listed him as one of the "50 Most Influential People in Sports Business," and Worth magazine listed him as one of "The 60 Most Powerful People In Sports" in March 2016.

Dr. Hershkowitz currently serves as the Environmental Science Advisor to the New York Yankees. He is the first and only person in sports to hold the title Environmental Science Advisor. He also serves as Chairman of the Board and Founding Director of Sport and Sustainability International. Prior positions include, co-founder and President of the USA-based Green Sports Alliance, co-founder of the Broadway Green Alliance, and co-founder of the Environmental Paper Network. Hershkowitz developed the environmental program and oversaw the greening of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences' Oscars telecasts from 2007-2015, as well as the greening of the Recording Academy's GRAMMY Awards from 2008-2014.

His affiliations with the nation's most prominent leaders and agencies run deep. Dr. Hershkowitz helped author President Clinton's "Greening the Government" Presidential Executive Order in 1993, and he served for nine years on the DuPont Corporation's Bio-Based Fuels Life Cycle Assessment Advisory Board. He has also served on the National Academy of Sciences' National Research Council Committee on the Health Effects of Waste Incineration.

Dr. Hershkowitz lectures regularly throughout the world including at the Wharton School of Business, Columbia University, and many other universities. He is author and co-author of many influential books, reports and articles, including "Bronx Ecology: A Blueprint for a New Environmentalism" (Island Press, 2002) and "Mascots At-Risk: How the Sports Industry Can Save Species" (New York: NRDC, 2014).

Dr. Hershkowitz has received awards from the U.S. EPA, the American Institute of Architects, Scenic Hudson, The Center for Discovery, the California Resource Recovery Association (lifetime achievement award), the Natural Resources Defense Council, and numerous other organizations. A native of New York, Dr. Hershkowitz received his Ph.D. in political economics from CUNY Graduate School in 1986. He earned a M. Phil. in political economics in 1982, a B.A. (cum laude) from CCNY in 1978 and a Certificat D'assiduite from the University of Grenoble in 1975. He shares his time between his homes in Connecticut, Europe, and California and is the father of three children.

Dr. Hershkowitz is also a proud recipient of the 2019 Townsend Harris Medal.

William Gati is a distinguished professional in the fields of architecture and education, whose influence resonates both within City College of New York (CCNY) and the architectural industry as a whole. With an unwavering dedication to his craft and a diverse range of talents, he has earned a well-deserved reputation as a beacon of inspiration to many.

As the Founder and Principal of Architecture Studio in Richmond Hill, New York, Gati has consistently showcased his architectural expertise. Simultaneously, he serves as an adjunct professor at the prestigious New York Institute of Technology (NYIT) on Long Island, where his transformative classes have left an indelible mark on his students. Recognizing the importance of mentorship, he has also joined the advisory board of a local high school specializing in Construction, Engineering, and Architecture. Through his teachings there, he has garnered the esteemed Educator Award for his invaluable contributions. Gati's passion is also evident through his longstanding involvement with the CCNY Alumni Association, dedicating his time and resources to its success. As a composer and Juilliard-trained pianist, he infuses his musical talent into CCNY Alumni gatherings and award ceremonies, adding a touch of elegance and artistry to these events.
