## 1. Bug Fixes

### **[CUS-553] - Performance problems when filtering journal entries after GL Account Code**

In Journal entries custom views, when filtering by GL Account Code, timeout errors were displayed. In V5.4 Mambu fixed this performance issue for GL Account Code filter in custom views.

### **[CUS-316] - Client API call retrieving all loans with fullDetails causing timeout errors**

When getting all the loan accounts with custom fields via API for a client, timeout errors were thrown. In V5.4 Mambu fixed this performance problem and now we get the loan accounts for a client without any error. Also, we allow now to add pagination for the loan accounts that are retrieved for a client.

### **[CORE-76] - Penalties applied at import are re-applied by cron job**

For the imported accounts with overdue principal/interest penalty calculation method, after cron job ran, it applied the penalty transactions, even if these were already imported. This was because the penalty applied date was null in database for the imported transactions. In V5.4 Mambu fixed this behavior and now the imported penalties are not re-applied by cron anymore.

#### **Note:**

In Mambu V5.5 we rolled back the fix for [CORE-157](#) because the process of bulk payments cannot be started if there was another process in progress in the same time on the background machine.
