Behind many of the changes inspired by Vatican II stands the work of Jesuit theologian Karl Rahner (1904-1984), considered by many to be the foremost Catholic thinker of the 20th century. At the time of his death he had published more than 4,000 books, articles and encyclopedia entries on almost every conceivable theological topic.

Rahner's insightful reconception of traditional Catholic beliefs remained thoroughly orthodox, deriving its core inspiration from personal prayer and the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola.

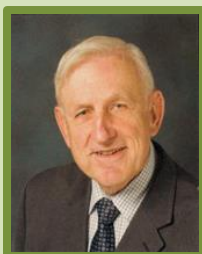
This seven-session seminar will provide a simple introduction to and overview of Rahner's massive theological works, focusing on his major essays on faith today, the mystery of God and human existence, the Incarnation, the unity of the love of God and the love of neighbor, devotion to Mary, and the future of the Church.
