A new APTI-Learn for state, local government, and tribal air agencies



EPA's National Air Quality Training Program has some good news to share! We have replaced our old Learning Management System (LMS) for state, local government, and tribal air agency staff. The new LMS will provide significantly improved performance and functionality for air quality training professionals. State, local government, and tribal air agency staff must register at <https://epaapti.csod.com> to gain access to the LMS; step by step instructions for registration are provided below, as well as on the registration page. There is no deadline to register.

Other learners, including members of the public, industry representatives, local communities, the international community, and EPA staff will not register in the new system, but will continue to access course materials through the old LMS via <https://apti-learn.net> until the platform is retired in the spring of 2021. After that point, EPA staff will access course materials via FedTalent and all other learners will access the materials via a new web portal.

The new LMS is organized around eight air quality training curricula. Learners using the new system can use these curricula as default learning plans, and will also have flexibility to design their own learning plans. Course materials have been modularized so that learners can choose modules of interest, or they can choose to include an entire course or set of courses as part of their learning plan. To chart your path, you can search by subject area, by curriculum, and/or by learning objective.

CURRICULA AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This LMS is arranged according to eight new air quality curricula:

- Air Pollution Basics
- Air Quality Modeling
- Air Quality Planning
- Air Toxics Rule Development and Implementation
- Ambient Air Monitoring
- Emissions Inventories
- Permitting
- Source Emissions Testing and Source Emissions Monitoring



Some course gaps exist where EPA does not yet have course content related to a given curriculum learning objective. Course materials will be developed and updated continuously.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

The new LMS is focused on the training needs of staff from state, local government, and tribal air agencies. These learners will need to register in the new system in order to gain access. To register, follow these steps:

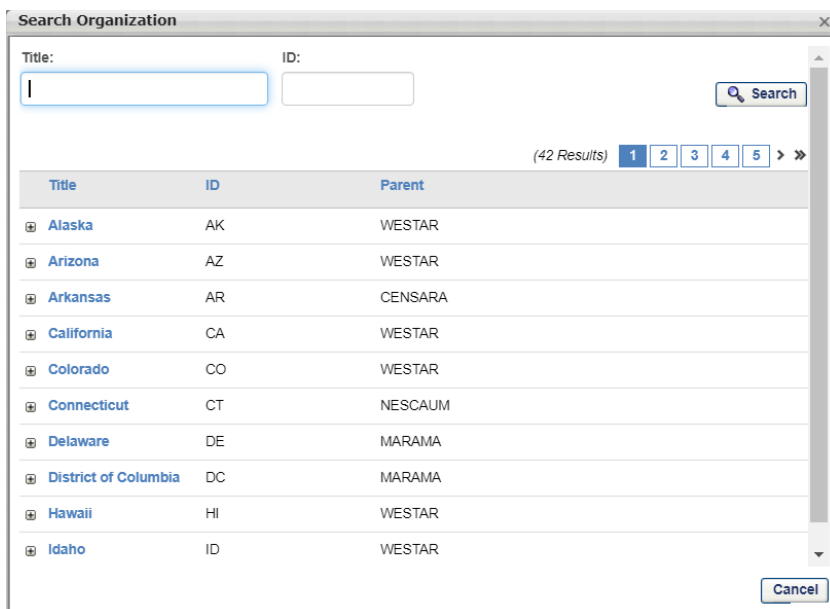
3. Select your state, local government, or tribal organization.

- State air agencies are located under the state name.
- Local organizations are located under the state name. The + sign next to each state expands the list to show the suborganizations in a state.
- Tribes are listed under the “Tribe” title; specific tribes can be found using the search function.
