

**Susan B. Anthony***Justice Activity Sheet*

Have students line up on one side of the classroom. Explain to them that they will be taking a step each time a question applies to them.

Sample Questions:

1. You are (name an age most students are).
2. You go to (name the school you are in).
3. You brought lunch from home today.
4. You have black hair.
5. You have blue eyes.
6. You are right handed.
7. You were born in January.
8. You have one sister.
9. You wear glasses.
10. You ride the bus to school.

Add more questions that would pertain to your students. Try to make them things that they have little or no control over (such as hair color and eye color). You want to have at least 10 questions--enough for someone to make it to the other side of the room to be named the winner.

Once the winner has been determined, then an authentic discussion can begin about fairness and justice.
