"Witches of Eastwick" (1987)

However, it was that devilish black 600 that played a central role in "The Witches of Eastwick" (1987) which made the most significant impression on me, one that would tease me for nearly two decades. Fast forward twenty years later when, on a bet from a friend, a black 1972 600 sedan listed on eBay landed in my hands.

Many have written about the 600's many famous owners. They have ranged from presidents (including every World Bank-cheating African "WaBenzi") to potentates and pontiffs. Owners have even included all the Beatles (except McCartney), Elvis, Coco Chanel, Jamiroquai... and on and on... and in 2006, it was me. It is not a typical ride of choice for a 38 year old. The 600 is neither a heart-pumping sports car nor an adventure-inspiring SUV. It did, however compete nicely with sports cars of its day and has the ability to raise its suspension by over two inches. At 2.5 plus tons it is a behemoth laced with a network of aircraft-quality hydraulics disguised under a veil of thick Rossier leather and Brazilian rosewood (actually, an extinct variety of Palisander). purchase, however, fulfilled my yearning desire to possess one ... damn that Daryl Von Horne. Feelings of elation and surprise soon turned to frustration and surprise (at the repair bills). Well, as the saying goes: "Be careful what you wish for".

as "their playground", translation: expensive to build, and even more expensive to maintain. Under my ownership it has gone from that famous German W100 expert in Wisconsin to local independents in Connecticut and California (one of whom believed it was his own since it was in his shop for a nearly a year). Expensive to keep? Yes. Emotionally stirring? Yes. Masculine and strong (don't ever call it pretty or cute)? Yes. Uncommonly evil? Hell, yes! I could save myself some aggravation and secure a Mercedes S-class, or a young-timer Mercedes. But either choice would be way too easy and never stir the same controversy among onlookers. The 600 has immense presence and its very name elicits endless emotions.

I love this overly complex and expensive to repair car. It represents my high maintenance and distracting dark side. In 1965, Road & Track best described the 600's impact this way:

"It is obviously strong, for example. It is immensely solid. And durable. Its stolidity is unrelieved, however, and nowhere is there anything that could be described as subtle. It is a thoroughly no-nonsense sort of car. One could hardly imagine a seduction scene played in it, for instance. Rape, maybe, but not seduction."

I leave it with that.
