# **Stargazing**

### **Back-up Cameras**

A consumer group has the US government in court for failing to implement a 2008 Presidential directive to set rear visibility standards for cars and light trucks by 2011 (click). The US Department of Transportation has repeatedly put off the new regulation, which is expected to force automakers to install backup cameras in all new vehicles sold there. This would very likely affect the Canadian market as well.

A study in the US in 2010 reported an average of 292 deaths and 18,000 injuries a year from 'back-over' accidents, with 44% of the deaths being children under the age of five. The cost to manufacturers for adding a backup camera is estimated at between \$58 and \$203 per vehicle, and US carmakers have been solidly against the new rule. A backup camera with wide-angle lens is part of MB's Intelligent Drive technology but it requires the COMAND telematics display and is not standard on all vehicles.
