2nd Annual Historic Road Rally



June Jamboree

In August of 1959, Mercedes introduced a totally new type of car. Unibody in construction and designed with the safety of the passengers in mind, the styling was what defined this new range of vehicles from then on. The rear fenders of the new models had a distinctive tail fin reminisent of american cars of the fifties. Some loved it, some hated it but they sold in large numbers. The cars became known as Fintails in this country and Heckflossen in Germany.

In the spring of 1977 I was a part-time college student happily driving a beat-up Ford Falcon when I received a fateful phone call from my father informing me that I had just purchased a 1963 Mercedes and that I should bring \$300.00 to a downtown transmission shop right away. I was quite miffed that I should have my money spent for me and upon seeing the car with it's poor paint and even rattier interior, I was sure that my social life was doomed. I had very little disposable income those days so I had to learn to make my own repairs.



I came to love that car and drove it for 18 years before the southern Florida salt air finally took it's toll. I have owned many other Mercedes since and still have more than I should. When my son was 14 years old I stumbled on to a 1965 220S that was very similar to my first Benz. I brought it home and told my son "If you help me restore it, you can have it." Well the car is now beautiful and Alex has become a proud owner and loves to show the car as well as drive it. When the MBCA Northern New Jersey Section announced that their Annual June Jamboree car show would

be celebrating the 50th year of the fintail I knew we had to be a part of it.

We packed up and left on Thursday morning at the crack of dawn and headed up I-81 through Virginia and ended up at the doorstep of our friend Stu Hammel, in Reading PA where we would spend the night. Friday was our day to relax and clean the car. A special trip was made to the Amish Farmers Market for some fresh corn and smoked ring bologna as well as a case of Reading Draft Company black cherry soda.



Saturday morning found us cruising towards Mercedes Benz head quarters in Montvale NJ about two and a half hours away. Stu drove his 300SEL 6.3 and we followed with our fintail. As Alex steered into the parking area, he became quite excited at seeing so many pristine examples of classic Mercedes scattered around the display area. After registering we found our designated parking spot and proceeded to unload the chairs and cleaning supplies. Alex was so intent on cleaning the road dirt that he didn't notice the rest of our group heading to enjoy the breakfast buffet set up in the company cafeteria. After wiping the muffin crumbs from our chins we ventured out to view the various models on display. It was very interesting to see some of the bread and butter cars from

the past such as 220D's and 108 sedans lovingly restored and maintained. But the reason for our trip was the fintails which were lined up together on one group. The whole range was represented, from the 190D to the 220SE.

We mingled until the judging was over and then proceeded to the cafeteria along with several hundred other enthusiasts. Mercedes had graciously provided a buffet lunch of German and Italian sausages, hamburgers and bar-b-que chicken. After lunch the emcee gave out what seemed like two hundred door prizes. I tend not to pay much attention to the awards for other classes so I sat there in a bratwurst-induced stupor waiting for the fintail awards. The moment arrived. Sitting at the edge of our seats and despite many equally prepared cars, the judges gave Alex's 220S first place in his class.

As we drove away for the long ride back to Reading, the rain that was threatening all day finally fell. Alex has a new found appreciation for his vintage car and I believe he's on his way to a lifelong hobby.
