CAR SHOW HIGHLIGHTS


Kickoff of the 2018 Show Season!

NEW MERCEDES-BENZ A-CLASS



Production of the new Mercedes-Benz A-Class began in Rastatt, Germany on April 19. This fourth generation A-Class includes integration of Mercedes-Benz User Experience or MBUX, which is Daimler's newest multimedia system which will eventually be installed in all Mercedes-Benz vehicles.

Markus Schäfer, Member of the Divisional Board of Mercedes-Benz Cars, Production & Supply Chain, drove the first unit off the assembly line.

Production of the A-Class series started with the W168 at the Rastatt plant in 1997 with the A140 & A160. The W168 became infamous in 1997 after flipping over during the traditional "Elk Test" performed by the Swedish automobile publication *Teknikens Värld*. According to the report, the W168 overturned when maneuvering to avoid a simulated "elk." Mercedes initially denied the problem, but then took corrective action by recalling all units (2,600) and suspending sales for three months. The instability was addressed by adding an electronic stability control system (ESC) and modifying the suspension to the tune of DM 300,000,000 or about \$268,078,204 in today's dollars.

The new Mercedes-Benz A-Class is equipped with the latest advanced driving assistance systems. Many tech elements found in the S-Class trickled down to the hatchback and some new items debuting in the W177 will "trickle up" to the the rest of the model range, eventually finding their way into the S-Class. The new A-Class front track has increased by 14 mm (continued next page)

while the wheelbase grows by 30mm, thus enlarging overall interior space. The new car is also 3db more quiet inside than the earlier models according to Mercedes.

The MBUX contains a unique feature that lets the car learn from the preferences and habits of the driver, thanks to artificial intelligence. Its intelligent voice control is activated by simply saying "Hey Mercedes." Not to be confused with "Hey Siri."

GORDEN WAGENER - CHIEF DESIGN OFFICER

Gorden Wagener became Chief Design Officer of Daimler AG in 2016 after 19 years with the company. Herr Wagener joined Mercedes-Benz as a designer in 1997 after graduating from the University of Essen with a degree in Transportation Design and subsequently the Royal College of Art in London.

Gorden and his international team are responsible for the design of all brands and products within Daimler AG, including all cars as well as a "holistic" corporate design of all brands, with the focus on the Mercedes-Benz brand.


In 2009 Herr Wagener developed the design philosophy known coined as "sensual purity," which he claims "defines a modern luxury."

Wagener worked closely on such designs as the new E-Class, C-Class, S-Class models as well as the GLE Coupé and GLC. In addition, he was a principal on the Mercedes-AMG GT along with numerous show-cars such as the Concept EQ, the Vision Mercedes-Maybach 6 and the F015 Luxury in Motion.

Gorden Wagener was born on September 3, 1968, in Essen, North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany.
