New Safety Feature for M-B Cars

Mercedes-Benz is introducing Rescue AssistSM as a safety feature for all new cars starting November 1, 2013 and one that can be retrofit to cars made back to 1990. A QM code sticker is generated for each model and year that can be scanned by any portable device with a camera and that has



downloaded the appropriate App. One sticker is applied to the "B" pillar on the driver's side and another inside

the gas filler cap. An example of the sticker is shown here. To try this


function, go to the App store for your device and download the QR reader of your choice. A first responder can scan the QR code and get images of the locations of batteries, air bags, gas tank and fillers along with structural information on the particular vehicle




in the accident. This information allows a rescue to be performed with more safety for the responders and potentially faster for the vehicle occupants. Owners of cars without this feature can stop at any Mercedes dealer and have stickers generated for their vehicle.

Names Changing for Mercedes-Benz Car Lines

There has been an ongoing and sometimes even successful attempt to make the nomenclature for the various Mercedes models relate to their type, size, engines and other features. The chart below shows the new naming system with previous designations in very small print under the new names. The core model letters are not changed, but all SUV's and crossovers now begin with "G". The SLX roadster becomes the SLC.



In addition there is a small letter that indicates the particular technology that is used to power the vehicle (except for 4MATIC which remain the same).



The expectation is that the new system allows more flexibility for introducing new models with nomenclature that is both consistent and understandable. We shall see.



Members were given several talks on detailing, repair capabilities, new model nomenclature, Rescue Assist and a tour of the maintenance shop area. M-B of Cary has a very experienced service staff with several service technicians having thirty years on the job. Thus they are in a position to do work not only on newer cars, but also the cars that are achieving classic status.



The service area at the dealership had about 25 lift positions for working on cars. Almost all had the lifting columns below floor level for less obstruction while doing car servicing.
