

SNOW, SALT & SAND the three dreaded "S's" to harm our cars finish. With the cold and bad road conditions we can't always wash our vehicles in the winter. I know we like to have clean cars but it isn't always possible. One alternative is to power wash the sand, salt and snow away. Cars tend to start rusting in the lower front

fenders, inside

the wheel wells, behind trim and of course at all body seams. Any little nick, scratch or chip in the paint deep enough to reach the metal is inviting rust. Local drive thru carwashes do a great job making our cars look good but are they really



getting all the hidden salt from behind moldings, trim, and wheel wells? Not really! Any self-serve carwash cost about \$1.50 to \$2.50 to start it up and you can add more quarters if you like. Spray the body moldings and watch closely and you will see the dirt and

debris that is trapped behind it run out. I think I tend to rinse mine off in the evenings or more than once a day depending on how bad it is. I don't like my vehicle sitting all evening with all the salt and sand working its evil on the finish. Spray the wheel wells, the inside of the fenders and the





bumpers. Rinse up underneath, around the exhaust, and any other area where two parts come together. Spending a few minutes and a couple bucks every couple of days will help reduce the amount of salt that stays on your vehicle's finish and reduce the risk

of rust. Mercedes Benz builds durable reliable


cars but Indiana winters can sure eat away at anything made of steel. We need to do everything we can to keep our cars looking their best. Stay warm and think Spring!

The Western Michigan Section of the Mercedes-Benz Club of America is excited to announce the 2015 season opening event. We have partnered with the Gilmore Car Museum (GCM), to offer all automotive enthusiasts an exceptional activity.

The GCM began in 1963, founded by Donald Gilmore. The museum opened to the public for the first time on Sunday, July 31, 1966. Today, the GCM campus includes many historic structures, and automobiles, including vintage dealerships, and a recreated 1930s Shell gas station. Over 300 vehicles are displayed from several museum collections, ranging from The Model A, to Pierce-Arrows and Duesenbergs. For our event, the museum staff is preparing a special day. It will be open not only to MBCA members, but all automotive enthusiasts. The powerpoint program presentation is, indeed, specific to Mercedes-Benz, but the balance of the day is enjoying the Gilmore collection and grounds.

The Gilmore team will provide a guided tour of certain collections in the morning. After lunch, the Gilmore Education Staff will present a program on Mercedes-Benz, "History of the Marque". The day has been specially planned for our Club.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF INCREASE IN MEMBERSHIP DUES

It has been a busy year at Mercedes-Benz Club of America (MBCA). We have been working hard to enhance your membership experience and are committed to making your membership a valuable and memorable experience.

To properly serve our members, the Board of Directors has approved \$6 increase in annual membership dues, effective July 1, 2015. This increase reflects rising costs and expansion of member services, particularly event support. Multi-year membership discounts will continue to be offered. We encourage all existing members to lock in the current rate by renewing for one, two or three years prior to July 1, 2015. Currently, the cost for 1 year is \$49.
