F1 Update

Great Britain

After the penalty assessed at the British Grand Prix, Nico Rosberg found himself with only a one-point lead over his teammate, Lewis Hamilton. The FIA decided to make clarifications to the rules to ensure that there are no further questions on the communication issues. An unlucky yellow flag in qualifying gave Rosberg the pole position but Hamilton overcame his qualifying troubles to take another win, his fifth in six races. Along with the race win, Hamilton took over the points lead.

Germany

Germany was next at Hockenheim. The home Grand Prix for Mercedes-AMG played out almost identically to the Hungarian race. A stellar qualifying performance from Rosberg was all for little as a shaky start had him quickly fall back to fourth where he stayed for most of the day. As with Hungary, Hamilton was there from second to pick up the race win and extend his championship lead.

Belgium

After weeks of strong showings by Hamilton, it was finally time for the car to get overhauled. Combining the earlier mechanical woes with another series of fixes between the race saw one of the largest penalties in history being assessed. Even though there are only 22 cars in a race, Lewis Hamilton was assessed a 60 grid place penalty to start the Belgian Grand Prix. Even with that handicap, the Brit put on a great performance to make it onto the podium. Rosberg, finally finding his way to capitalize on the qualifying performance he had been showing for weeks, once again found himself in the winner's circle.

Italy

With Hamilton's car in peak condition following the previous race's rebuild, pole position was easily gained at the Italian Grand prix. But even the best car on the grid needs help getting off the line as another poor start from Hamilton saw him drop immediately back to sixth and yield the lead to his teammate. Rosberg pounced on this chance and had an easy drive to another win. Hamilton would have to settle for second.

F1 Update Continued

Singapore

Singapore's Yas Marina has always been a worry for the Mercedes-AMG team. The tight turns and relatively short straights oppose the design of these powerhouse vehicles. Even with this, the team found success at the night race and Rosberg and Hamilton found themselves on the podium in 1st and 3rd respectively. With the momentum on his side, Rosberg once again took the lead in points.

Malaysia

While a perfect season was out of the question early, the brutal speed of the Mercedes factory pair would have been enough to finish the season without another blemish. Unfortunately, this was not to be with an unforgiving Malaysian Grand Prix. Hamilton finally had a proper start from pole and was gearing up to cruise on, but a first turn incident involving the Redbull of Riccardo, the Ferrari of Vettel, and the Mercedes-AMG of Rosberg put the championship points leader to dead last. A strong push throughout the race would put him back to third, but only because of the problems Lewis Hamilton encountered after lap 40. The freshly rebuilt engine of the Mercedes-AMG expired in a ball of smoke, putting him out of the race. What could have been a constructor's championship day in Malaysia would have to be postponed.

Japan

Things were back to normal at the Japanese Grand Prix. The front row was all Mercedes-AMG once again with Rosberg on pole. As had happened on many races this season, Hamilton couldn't quite figure out the start and immediately dropped back to eighth. These issues off the grid are proving costly for the reigning champion.

Rosberg would take the win and Hamilton clawed his way back to the final place on the podium. This put Nico Rosberg 33 points ahead in the championship fight with only four races left in the season. The next race is October 23rd, here in the United States at Circuit of the Americas in Texas.

Rumors Abound for the Next Mercedes Hypercar

With a new class of hypercar on the rise, rumor has it that Mercedes-AMG is looking to make a grand return to the world's fastest. While the Mercedes AMG GT and SLS AMG have served as potent cars to lead the brand in the sports car world, a throaty V8 engine can only go so far in this world. Even the mighty Mercedes-McLaren SLR found it tough to show up in a world that was soon met with million dollar supercars and top speeds that could only be found on private test tracks. But the fastest Mercedes-Benz cars of the past have a racing lineage. World-beating power bred first for the track.

From the SSKL of old, to the legendary 300SL, and the modern classic 190E Cosworth and CLK-GTR, the best is found on the racetrack.

With that in mind, there are heavy rumors of a new hypercar coming just in time for AMG's 50th birthday coming up. Known under the code name R50, power is expected to come from a version of the dominant Formula 1 car. Horsepower numbers are thought to be exceeding 4 digits and a price in the millions. Just the kind of numbers and tech to bring a fight to the known kings of the hypercar class. 1

E-Class All Terrain

With a new E-class on the horizon, a surprise was announced for foreign markets at the Paris Auto Show. Following the sedan, wagon, coupe and, cabriolet forms that were announced earlier this year, a raised "All Terrain" version of the E-Class was shown. What this entails is a slightly raised platform and extra off road ready cladding for the E-Class 4-Matic Wagon. The extra ground clearance will give it an easier way across fields and snow but without going for the body shape found in the SUV range. At speeds, the vehicle can also lower it's suspension for a better ride and more stability. Hopefully, with the current popularity of the crossover, this niche vehicle will be considered for sale stateside as well. 2,3

Mercedes-Benz to Start New EQ Branded Electric Cars

The Paris Auto Show had a large focus on electric vehicles in general this year. Mercedes-Benz decided that the show would be a perfect time to announce its new line of EQ branded cars. Lit up in blue LEDs, a new crossover was the first to be shown at the show. Simply known as "Generation EQ," it has a projected power and range output very similar to that of the new generation of turbo V6-powered cars. The twin motors are expected to hit a respectable 400 horsepower and 310 miles of range in a package priced similar to a mid-range GLC.

The platform of the new concept is being made on modular chassis so that slight tweaks can be made to any number of body styles. With aluminum and carbon fiber playing bigger roles in the future, the efficiency and quality of these new cars should be great and give a good offering from Mercedes-Benz. 4,5
