

THE WILD AND WACKY WORLD OF EXOTIC CARS

Welcome to this month's edition of the WWWEC.

Speaking of exotics, we just returned from the exotic car show hosted by Boardwalk Ferrari in Dallas. There were 10s of millions of dollars' worth of exotics on display with everything there from Ferrari, Lamborghini, Pagani, Porsche, McLaren, Bentley, Aston Martin and other marques. There were even some run-of-the-mill Corvettes and Ford GTs. It was the best of Pebble Beach and Amelia Island for one afternoon. The only problem was the blaring music so loud that you couldn't hear yourself think. Why is it they play music that no one wants to hear at ridiculously loud volumes at car shows? We're here for the cars, not ear damage! Anyway, it was a great show except for the noise.

The F1 season is well underway with the most recent race in Miami. F1 put on a great show with Verstappen winning again, Perez second and Alonso third. The race would be a great event to attend but this is why you don't go. We were offered three-day passes to one of the suites for only \$9000 per person excluding parking. As for food and drink, the suite menu had the F1 appetizer platter for \$500. The chicken nachos were expensive at \$275 but they fed four! If you're sorry you missed the Miami race you still can catch the race in Las Vegas or Austin. Just make sure to get the limit on your credit card raised first!

With summer here, it's car show season as well. The main event as usual is Pebble Beach car week in August. If you want to attend any of the events now is the time to book your hotel and event tickets. However, inflation has hit Pebble Beach as well as everything else in the economy. As an example, one of the hotels we booked before for around \$500 a night is now \$1,600 a night. If you would like to attend without booking everything yourself there are also all-inclusive packages with hotel and event tickets available in the \$20,000 range per couple. The packages do not include airfare.

Things are a little quiet in the exotic car world concerning announcements of new vehicles except for Aston Martin. The 2024 cars will have a refresh of the interiors and exteriors. The preview of the new cars drops this week. If you missed out buying one of the \$3 million Aston Valkyries, the Valhalla will start production in 2024. The car will be bargain priced compared to the Valkyrie at only \$800k. It will have a 4-liter twin-turbo V8, sourced from Mercedes, and two electric motors producing 937 hp and 738 lb. ft of torque. Interestingly, if you need to sneak into or out of the house in the middle of the night, it has an electric only range of about 10 miles.

On the auction front, the big winner at Amelia Island was a 1962 Ferrari Cal Spider selling for \$18 million. A 1974 Ferrari Dino 246 sold for \$967,500. I remember looking at one new for \$16,000. A 2015 McLaren P1 \$2,425,000. A 1991 560 SEC AMG 6.0 widebody coupe sold for \$885,000. A 2010 Pagani Zonda R sold for

\$5,340,000. A 2022 Bugatti Chiron sold at the Paris auction for \$10,667,000.

Online auction prices have softened some and prices are soft on cars such as the new 2023 Aston Martin V12 Vantage Coupe which are not bringing sticker for the customers trying to flip them for a profit.

Prices at the Mecum Indianapolis auction were soft on numerous muscle cars which will be interesting as we go into the summer.







Keeping up with tradition, after lunch we made the quick trip to fellow MBCA member John Bowers' Garage to check out all of his amazing rides! This was a great day!






