From Our President.....

What is the longest that you have owned a Benz?

What drew you to the Mercedes Benz marquee? Was it styling, performance, or safety? For me it has always been about the longevity that has long been associated with owning a Mercedes Benz. In a previous career, I worked with a lot of factory representatives and regional sales managers. The ones that drove a Mercedes would tout the advantages of

the road manners of a Benz. Being able to cover a multiple state territory and arriving refreshed at their destination. They could also rack up hundreds of thousands of miles before they would have to consider a replacement. Pulling up in a Mercedes also conveyed to a customer that you were dealing with a successful representative.

My kids grew up with a Mercedes in the family. They were chauffeured to soccer, scouts, and swimming practice in a Mercedes. One evening when my wife was bringing my son home from a Cross Country meet in her E Class, an inattentive driver rear ended them. I was astounded at how the design of the E Class had kept the speeding Ford Explorer from entering the cabin of the car. If they had been driving another brand of sedan, that Explorer would have ended up in the back seat! That E Class was replaced with another, which we still have.

When my son turned 16 in 2014, he chose to buy a Mercedes. He found a 1998 C280, which he has been driving ever since. Fast forward to June 2023. My son is 25. The car that he has owned for 9 years, the only car he has ever owned, is also 25. The little C280 was in need of some repairs, a bit of rust was showing, as well as some battle scars from the car's life in Philadelphia. My son and I stopped in at the car lot where he bought the C280, just looking. There sat a 2009 W204 C300. Do you think I should consider replacing my car? Should I test drive it?

We took the C300 for a test drive. He really liked it. We thanked the owner of the lot for the test drive and left. Later that weekend, my son said, "I can't stop thinking about that car".

I said, "If you want it, let me get them to put it on a lift, and I will check it out. If it's ok, I'll give them a deposit". He bought the car. Will he keep this one for 9 years? Probably not. But you never know!

Keystone Section Picnic and Clean Car Show Masonic Village Picnic Pavilion Elizabethtown, PA September 10, 2023

We will be meeting again this year, at the Masonic Village in Elizabethtown. Our picnic will be at the Masonic Village Picnic Pavilion on Eden View Road. For those of you who may be somewhat familiar with the Masonic Village campus, the Picnic Pavilion is just a stone's throw from the Farm Market.

Once again, we will gather about 3 p.m. to show off our newly cleaned and hopefully sparkling Benz. Our picnic dinner will begin at 4:30 p.m. and will include BBQ Baby Back Ribs, BBQ Chicken, Baked Potato Bar, and Corn on the Cob, plus cookies and brownies for dessert. Iced tea, coffee, soft drinks, and water will also be provided.

<u>Directions to the Picnic Pavilion</u> – Come in the main entrance to the Village off Masonic Drive, just opposite the entrance to the railroad station. Travel on Freemason Drive for 0.2 miles. Make the first right turn onto Eden View Road, and continue on Eden View Road for 0.6 miles, to the stop sign. At the stop sign, stay on Eden View Road. The Picnic Pavilion is on the right, 0.3 miles past the stop sign. If you come to a second stop sign, the one at the Farm Market, you've gone too far. GPS address - 250 Eden View Road, Elizabethtown.

show merchandise. Your admission includes tickets, good for the purchase of food.




Over 40 Mercedes were on display this year. The cars range from the 1950's to some current models, including a G-Wagon and a Uni-Mog.

This show is a great outdoor event that provides a nice ride to the greater Reading area and a really interesting sample of German auto


