
Christmas Party

THE WILD AND WACKY WORLD OF EXOTIC CARS

This is no weather for exotics, at least in the traditional sense, so we will talk about some exotic SUVs. Whatever you're driving, remember to check your air pressures. This isn't just a summer thing. The cold weather sucks those oxygen molecules right out of your tires. So pay attention.

First up is the new Ferrari Purosangue, which translates to Purebred in English. While Ferrari is building hybrids and will have some full electric cars by 2030 the Purosangue is not one of them. It has the fire breathing 715 horsepower V12 with an 8,250 rpm redline under the hood.

It's more of a four-door four-passenger crossover sports car, than an SUV. And starting at about \$450,000, it should be. By the way, the V12 not only stands for 12 cylinders but the in town gas mileage as well! Ferrari plans on building up to 1,500 a year. So now is the time to get in line for the second year of production as the first year is already sold out.

Not to be outdone, Lamborghini has introduced the Urus Performante. While it only has fifteen more horsepower than the standard Urus (657 to 642) it has a whole host of suspension, steering, hardware and chassis software upgrades that turn it into a forty-seven hundred pound canyon carver. Its 0-60 time is the same as the Ferrari at 3.3 seconds to 60 but that's not the point of the car. Lamborghini wanted to build the

best driver's car in the super SUV segment. It looks like they have succeeded. If you are interested there are new reviews out there. Pricing is about \$300,000.

Switching gears, what if you want something that costs a lot less, gets better gas mileage and has the same kind of 0-60 performance that the Ferrari and Lamborghini have? Well you're in luck. You can now buy a midsize SUV that has a 0-60 time of 3.2 seconds, gets great gas mileage because it's electric and costs less than \$65,000 fully loaded. What is it? The KIA EV6 GT. That's right. You can now buy a KIA electric SUV that's faster in a stoplight grand prix than a Porsche 911 GT 3. In the reviews its one downside is the battery pack is only good for around 210 miles. But it has an 800 volt system that recharges the battery rapidly on a DC fast-charger. Check one out if you feel the need for some cheap speed.

In the auction world things are still hopping. Mecum Kissimmee just set a record of \$3,135,000 for a 1992 Ferrari F40. A broker friend of mine passed on that car a few years ago for around \$1,000,000. On the Mercedes end a 1955 300SL Gullwing sold for \$1,650,000.

Cars are still bringing good money on BaT with a 1967 Datsun roadster selling for \$44,000. It was a very nice car and I almost bid on it as I had one in college. An interesting Mercedes no sale was a 2014 G63 AMG 6x6 Brabus B63S-700. It only bid to \$685,000! Last but not least a 1994 Toyota Supra Turbo was a no sale at \$150,000. The right cars are still bringing big money!
