



#### THE WILD AND WACKY WORLD OF EXOTIC CARS

Here we are in the middle of Spring Break which means it's cold, windy and rainy, just like it was for every Spring Break I had when I was in college. It's bad enough I had to work every Spring Break, but at least the weather could have given us a break. Oh Well, let's talk about our favorite subject, cars.

First up this month is the Corvette Z06. The Corvette guys are all excited that Chevy has produced their dream Corvette that can hang with the hyper-cars for half or less the money. The order books are full, and the cars are going for big blue sky. While only a few have been delivered, Chevy has already announced the new, faster E-Ray Hybrid coming in late 2023. It is a mid-engine, front motor, all-wheel drive 655HP hybrid terror. The drivetrain consists of the C8, 6.2L, 495HP V8 combined with a front mounted 160 HP electric motor giving us the 655HP total. With an estimated 0-60 time of 2.5 seconds, it's faster than anything we have talked about. The Z06 will still be the better handling track car as the E-Ray with its battery pack weighs in at svelte 4,000 plus pounds. I am just wondering what the point of this car is. I wonder who asked for a 4-wheel drive, hybrid Corvette? The base price is around \$110k.

McLaren has also introduced a new hybrid. The new car is the Artura. Its drivetrain consists of a 577HP, twin turbocharged, 3L, V6 with a 94HP electric motor for a combined output of 671HP. Unlike the Corvette, it's still 2-wheel drive. It has road tested at 0-60 in 2.6 seconds, the quarter mile coming in at 10.83 seconds and 180 mph at 19 seconds. It's not quite as fast as the 720S or 765LT but is meant to be a more comfortable exotic GT super car. It even has a 12 speaker Bowers & Wilkins stereo which is useless at full throttle due to the 88db interior sound level. The Artura is available now with a starting base price of \$240k with options you can easily push over \$300k.

Aston Martin has freshened the existing 2023 Vantage with the F1 Edition. The car has received minor tweaks to the engine, transmission and rearend, along with some racy stickers and a rear wing. The debut of this car coincides with the start of the new F1 season and Aston's renewed attempt at relevance in F1. Fernando Alonso, one of the new drivers for Aston in F1, did bring his car in for third place in the first race. So, kudos to him! Aston has also announced a refreshened interior and infotainment system for the 2024 cars.

Exotic car manufacturers have to keep upping the horsepower and performance envelopes of their vehicles because of the constant onslaught of the lesser performance vehicles encroaching on their territory. I bring this up because in a recent road test between the new Ford F-150 Raptor R and Ram 1500 TRX both vehicles had 0-60 times of less than 4 seconds. With the Ram running a 3.9 and the Ford running a 3.7 0-60. Keep in mind, both vehicles weigh over 6,000 lbs! They are not cheap at over \$100k each but they can smoke a number of performance cars in a stoplight Grand Prix.

We will have more auction coverage next month but suffice to say, prices are still up. Some examples: 2020 Ford GT - \$1,490,000; 1973 Ferrari Daytona - \$2,205,000; 2007 MB SLR - \$808,000; 1971 Pontiac Trans Am - \$171,000; and 1995 Ferrari F50 - \$5.4M.
