Distinguished Service Award-Gov. Kay Ivey


Legislator of the Year- Sen. Clay Scofield

Two Alabama's- The Challenge of Rural Economic Development

Dr. Joe Sumners, Auburn University Government & Economic Development Institute

Ben Mullins, AL Department of Agriculture and Industries

The Agriculture Emergency Programs Section, directed by Ben Mullins, is responsible for reducing the vulnerability to or the impact from any disaster, disease, or terrorist attack on the agriculture community of Alabama. Learn more about how the Emergency Programs Section works to protect and serve the agricultural industry before, during and after an emergency occurs.

Wild Pig Impacts in Alabama

Chris Jaworowski, AL Cooperative Extension System

With estimates exceeding \$100 million in damages annually feral hogs are a serious threat to Alabama. This presentation will examine wild pig history, biology, damage, disease, and control methods as well as the Rental Trap program and Extension workshops.

"Pollinators in Agriculture" Dr. Brittney Goodrich, Auburn University

Roughly \$18 billion in agricultural production in U.S. depends on pollinators, with a majority of that production depending on managed honey bees for pollination services. Recent honey bee health issues have received media attention, with agricultural pesticides often being blamed for their demise. This talk highlights the significance of pollinators in agriculture, in addition to discussing the necessity of pesticides as a pest management tool to farmers.
