Summary

Works on construction projects, usually working in utility capacity, by transferring from one task to another where demands require worker with varied experience and ability to work without close supervision by performing the following duties.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

Assembles equipment in hog buildings.

Measures distance from grade stakes.

Bolts, nails, align and block up under forms.

Signals operators of construction equipment to facilitate alignment, movement and adjustment of machinery to conform to grade specifications.

Levels earth to fine grade specifications.

Mixes concrete, smooth and finishes freshly poured cement or concrete.

Erects scaffolding, shoring and braces. Set up machines and equipment needed for various jobs on the site.

Mops, brushes or spreads paints or bituminous compounds over surfaces for protection.

Sprays materials such as water, sand, steam, vinyl, paint or stucco through hose to clean, coat or seal surfaces.

Applies caulking compounds by hand or with caulking gun to seal crevices.

Grinds, sands or polishes surfaces such as concrete, marble, terrazzo or wood flooring.

Demolishes buildings, saws lumber, dismantles forms, removes projections from concrete, mounts pipe hangers and cuts and attaches insulating materials.

Cutting materials to size, building concrete forms, erecting framework, laying flooring metal fabrication, welding and blow torch work.

Repair of existing hog building ventilation systems, feed equipment i.e. flex augers, feeders and tubing. Erecting and building bulk feed bins. Basic plumbing including waterlines and waterers. Fixing crates and gating.

Consistently at work and on time; works with integrity and ethically; uses time efficiently; and adapts to changes in the work environment.

Ability to weld is a benefit.

Follows Waukon Feed Ranch policies and procedures including safety and security procedures. Promotes a harassment-free work environment.

Qualifications

Education and/or Experience

High school diploma or general education degree (GED); prefer three months related experience and/or training.

Language Skills

Ability to read and comprehend simple instructions, short correspondence and memos. Able to write simple correspondence. Present information in one-on-one and small groups to customers and other employees.

Mathematical Skills

Able to add, subtract, multiply and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions and decimals. Ability to compute drawings measurements.

Reasoning Ability

Able to apply common sense understanding to carry out written and/or oral instructions. Ability to deal with problems.

Physical Demands
