The requirement of a house to live in and a workshop to work in was the criteria upon which the basis of the design were undertaken I have just graduated and had little money inorder to start my artistic career with. I was looking for a quite area, but not so far from Cairo. Ramses Wissa Wassef was my professor at the fine art College and I liked his philosophi, he understood my needs and my shortage of funds. The house section was designed on the north part of the land, while the work shop on the south. Both complete each other and form one unit, the interia of the house is constructed around an open cart which serves as a sitting area, open exhibition and working area too.

The architect has imagined and satisfied the requiremnt of the artist and hence the final work is a live piece of architecture.

The house is constructed from limestone and cement master Foundation (Local limestone), while external walls, internal walls and second floor domes are constructed from mud bricks manufactured or site.

ground floor domes are constructed from local red bricks and cement master.

All flootings are made of special dense red bricks which are extremely Cheep compare to any other floor tiles. They blend well with the Simple finish of the house.

The external walls are plastered with mud and sbud mixed together at certain proportions which makes the house blend with the country side so well and does not show dust at all and also extremely early to maintain.

The architect has succeeded in building a complete comfortable two floor house with the minimum costs possible using all the materials available to him from the area.

Because of the house has been built from mud bricks and plastered with mud so it needs rendering every four (4) or five years. No settelment cracles has appeared due to the use of limestone in the foundations.
