





Mosque and public buildings included in village plan









Entrance to one of the houses







Example of veranacular vaulted roof, near Tolga




Village comprises 120 houses arranged in groups of 4



10 masons trained in construction techniques. Mud bricks stabilised with 6% concrete.



Each houses has private courtyard to maintain traditional organisation




Access from "street" to private couryard of each house




Entrance courtyard of one house
