Located at the fringe of a semi-arid desert, BHONG is a small place in district Rahimyar Khan, Pakistan.

The climate is very hot during the Summer and sufficiently cold in Winter.

VIII.EVOLUTION OF DESIGN CONCEPTS

Please describe the history of the project, from its conception to its final construction and actual use.

The complex consisting of a mosque, a madrasa, a library and resting rooms, is a fabulous project within a vast area developed into a well laid park having tanks, fountains, grassy plots, shady trees etc. The complex is built on a raised platform approached through a flight of steps. The prayer chamber of the mosque consists of an enclosed hall and a verandah having R.C.C. roof on which are placed three domes. Marble especially a fine variety of Onyx has been used librally for flooring, arches, pillars, facades etc; while the interior walling and ceiling has stucco tracery with gilding, Multani painting and freeco. Glazed tiles, glass mosaic, stucco tracery, painting, mother of pearls has been used to decorate the exterior and interior surface.

of the Punjab. Little known for its population, it is devoid of any significant industrial or agricultural product. However, it has now become a sort of tourist resort because of this fabulously decorated little mosque. The project is important because it has been conceived on traditional local planning and crafts. Alongside the mosque, a madrassa, a library and rest-rooms have been created, all pleasently placed within an old enclosed garden. The work is the accomplishment of a local landlord of a cultured and learned family who created it to satisfy his spiritual urge and spared neither money nor devotion to complete it. The out come is very much significant in the local circumstances.

Dear Sir,

I regret the delay of my reply due to my absence since 30 June 1985 while performing the Umra and Haj pilgrimage in Saudi Arabia. It is an honour for us that the mosque built by my late father Rais Ghazi Mohammad Khan of Bhong has been nominated for his Highness the Aga Khan Award for Architecture 1986.

We are in the process of collecting the pertinent data required for the 'Clients Record' to be dispatched immediately on completion, I add some brief information for your persual.

Jamia Masjid Rais Ghazi Mohd is a superb example of the Islamic decorative art and architecture and is situated 25 km from Sadiqabad in the Punjab. Still under completion has cost millions of Rupees and two generations of love and labour of my father the late Rais Ghazi Mohd Khan landlord of Bhong, who devoted his life in response to a vision to build a mosque of such grand dimensions. The facade of the main entrance with cusped arches, sunmounted by three ribbed domes and eight minarets. The entrances are decorated with gilded verses of the Holy Quran, and multicoloured floral work of fine quality, while the main arch way displays the "Aaitol Kursi" in equisite Pietra-dura work done in mother of pearl. The interior walls and ceiling of the prayer chamber have been decorated with fine tilery and mirror work and receding classical decorative art of Multan craftsmen and Mughal Art being revived in modern times.

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In this construction no architect nor consultancy and accountancy was made nor any construction prints used except for the services rendered by Mistry Faiz Mohd in draftsmanship and supervision. The planning and design are the exclusive work of the ingenuity of the late Rais Ghazi Mohd Khan from his natural creative mind. Haji Rahim Baksh is merely one of the mentionable craftsmen of the mosque, one of several individuals patroned by my late father.

The mosque built displays his love and selfless devotion to Allah. Pre and post-partition he financed this personal project from the revenue of his personal land holding his sole source of income. He built this spiritual centre on infertile land where no irrigation nor power existed at that time so the local people could earn their live hood.

In view of the personal contribution of my father, and the prevailing condition of that time, the mosque built by the grace of Allah is one of the most beautiful mosque comparable to larger works sponsored by great patrons of Islamic Architecture in history.
