#### VI. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Gaoligong Museum of Handicraft Paper stands at the foot of Gaoligong Mountain in Tengchong county, Yunnan province. Built in a field at the edge of Xingzhuang village, the architecture provides a space for the exhibition of the ancient craft of handmade paper and related cultural artifacts produced in Xingzhuang village. The architect conceived a cluster of small buildings which, in unity, form a micro-village. The museum articulates the texture of the village through its use of local materials, formal expression, and visual connection with the landscape. The households in the village display their paper crafts to visitors, extending the exhibition beyond the boundaries of the museum. In turn, the museum consolidates the spatial experience of the village.

The museum experience constantly vacillates between delineated gallery spaces and tranquil farm and mountain landscapes. The visitor is guided through a series of interior spaces which simultaneously showcase exhibition materials while drawing in the exterior environment. Movement through the museum suggests the symphony of art, architecture and the natural environment. A central courtyard connects six individually-shaped galleries, forming a continuous path through the exhibition. The architecture also accommodates office spaces, tea rooms and guest rooms. A tea room is located on the first floor, which can open completely onto the central courtyard. Office spaces occupy the second floor, where an outdoor staircase leads up to the third floor guest rooms and a terrace from which visitors can access a view of the mountains.

# VII. MATERIALS, CONSTRUCTION AND TECHNOLOGY

The building uses local timber, bamboo, handcrafted paper, and other low energy-consuming and decomposable natural materials to minimize environmental effects. The architecture honestly reflects the building's materials, structure, and inner logic, as well as the traces left by its construction process. The museum responds to Yunnan's climate, and thoroughly makes use of local materials, technology and arts by integrating traditional timber construction with contemporary structural techniques. Since construction is completed entirely by local builders and craftsmen, the architecture itself is an active participant in the preservation of the region's traditional natural resources.

#### VIII. PROJECT SIGNIFICANCE AND IMPACT

The Gaoligong Museum of Handicraft Paper brings issues of preservation to the forefront while also actively working to connect the local community with people and activities beyond its own region.

In July 2010, the museum invited Master paper craftsmen from Yunnan Tengchong county, Jietou town, Xinzhuang village and Shangrila Sanba town, Baidi village to visit Beijing and exhibit Tengchong and Nakhi Dongba handcrafted paper art. Meanwhile, the museum and the Green Beagle Environment Institute jointly hosted "The Story of Papermaking", a conference engaging in topics concerning efforts to pass on traditional arts and preserve material culture.

The Gaoligong Museum of Handicraft Paper continues to develop collaborations between designers and contemporary artists, encourage exchange between craftsmen and buyers, and support the participation of handcrafted paper art in contemporary art and design, expanding the range of its use and application.
