Get a FREE pass to the National Parks and more...

With Covid-19 came a significant decrease in travel. Thankfully, with the vaccines, it seems people are ready to start traveling once again. However, many people are opting to travel in the US and push off foreign travel for another year and the US has lots to offer! And good news if you have ever wanted to visit our US National Parks and you have a hearing loss or other disability, you are eligible for a FREE Access pass. This is a lifetime pass available to you that can be used at over 2000 Federal recreation

sites in the US. The pass will also admit up to 3 adult passengers that are traveling with the pass holder. It may also offer other discounts at expanded amenities, such as camping areas.

The pass may be obtained either at a federal recreation site entrance or through the mail (if you apply through the mail, you will be charged a \$10.00



processing fee) . You must have identification to verify that you are a US citizen or permanent resident. You must also have documentation that you have a permanent disability. If you are interested in obtaining this pass, please give us a call and we will be happy to write a letter confirming your hearing loss so you can start your application. May is Better Hearing and Speech Month

This year, I want to focus on good communication habits. The person with hearing loss takes the first step to getting help by visiting us and getting appropriately fit amplification.
