

- An **Au.D.** is a Doctor of Audiology; This degree requires 4 years of undergraduate work as well as 4 years of doctoral audiology training.
- An Au.D. is trained to evaluate and treat sensorineural, conductive and mixed hearing losses including single sided deafness.
- An **Au.D.** examines and determines hearing disorders of the human auditory system and prescribes hearing aids and assistive listening devices to improve people's hearing.
- An Au.D. is trained to counsel and provide aural rehabilitation services to enhance communication for those with impaired auditory function.
- An Au.D. is trained to evaluate and treat disorders of the balance system.
- An Au.D. is trained to remove wax and other foreign bodies.
- An Au.D. is trained to evaluate and treat tinnitus (ringing in the ears) by providing education, counseling and/or sound therapy.
- An Au.D. is trained to provide hearing protection, custom musician's monitors and other custom ear pieces.
- An Au.D. is trained to evaluate and map implantable hearing devices for those where traditional amplification is not appropriate.
- An **Au.D.** is trained to evaluate and co-manage surgical ear conditions through the use of advanced technology such as hearing aids, implants and ear protection.
