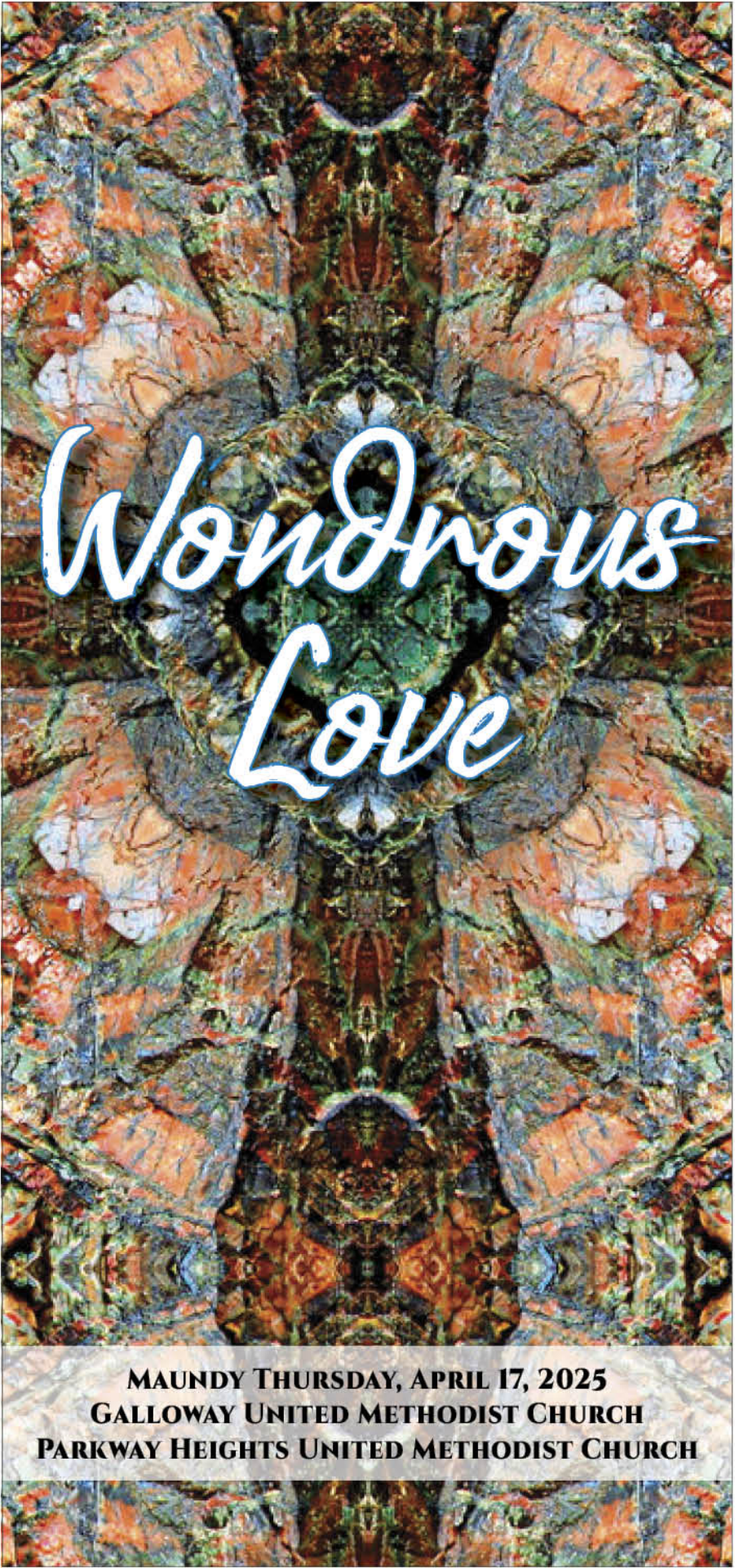

WELCOME

PRELUDE *The Peace May Be Exchanged (Rubrics, No. 4)* (Locklair)

GREETING

Leader: Christ Jesus gives us a new commandment.
People: He calls us to love one another as he has loved us.
Leader: How shall we live this commandment?
People: By the grace of God and the power of God's Spirit.

OPENING PRAYER

Infinite, intimate God: this night you kneel before your friends and wash our feet. Bound together in your love, trembling, we drink your cup and watch. Amen.

GUIDED MEDITATION

On this holy night, we remember the Lord Christ wrapped himself in a towel and knelt to wash his disciples' feet. Imagine Jesus kneeling at your feet. Listen as the water splashes in the basin; feel Jesus' hands touch your feet, and let your heart cry: Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.

SCRIPTURE 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

GUIDED MEDITATION

The cross expresses God's most powerful act of love in Christ Jesus toward us. Meditate on the wonders of God's awesome love for you and remind yourself there is nothing you can do, or not do, that would change God's great love for you. Rest in the strength of that love and release your burdens to God.

GUIDED MEDITATION

Knowing his time had come to leave this world and go to the Father, Jesus was fully present to his disciples as he washed their feet. Later that night, he was fully present to God in the Garden of Gethsemane as he agonized in prayer. He urged the ones with him to remain awake and present to God through their own prayers.

For a moment, consider the idea of prayer as a means of being awake and present to God. How might this change your life of prayer?

We are no different than the crowds. There are times we welcome the love of Christ with open hearts and lives. However, at other times we betray Christ's love.

And yet, Jesus still offered himself for us. As you listen to *Crucifixus*, meditate on these words: He was also crucified for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried.

How is God's love drawing you? What is your response?
