Because so few teach on spiritual warfare, we are vulnerable. It's a difficult topic to teach due to the differing spiritual growths of those being taught. There are 'baby' Christians, mature Christians and everyone in-between, with understanding being on different levels. Lack of comprehension creates confusion, not only of why these attacks occur but why we must stand, in faith, trusting God. We will not know them as attacks until we understand spiritual warfare. Even Jesus, speaking to his disciples said, "I have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now," John 16:12.

It was years of questioning my first fierce battle before learning the antidote. The learning curve could have been shortened considerably if someone, somewhere, had been teaching on the subject. The fact remains that, while decades have passed, there is still very little teaching on spiritual warfare, especially in the church. Some Bible studies offer them and there are good books on the topic, but books do not offer the same insight as someone who has been battered by the battle yet stands strong in their faith and trust in God.

Why do these battles occur? Because as soon as we said, "I do," to the Lord, the devil put his crosshairs on us. If we are hunters, we understand crosshairs. In a hunting scope, the crosshairs define the target area on whatever we are shooting, game or targets. Now the devil's scope has lined up on us because his goal is to destroy our faith. That's why the battles occur. We must learn how to combat this spiritually, as we'll be involved in spiritual warfare throughout our life. The single most important truth about spiritual warfare is that the battle belongs to the Lord. We are to stand in His strength, unwavering, trusting, obeying, and believing. "All things are possible to those who believe." Mark 9:23

It is during this process of trusting and obeying that we see the love and caring God pours out on us. Like circles of love it continually widens as our faith and trust grow. When we see what God has done for us, we grow in faith, learning to trust and obey even more. Each time God wins another battle for us, we understand that we are never alone in the battles we face.

If you want to learn more about spiritual warfare, read Ephesians 6:10-18. Learn what God has provided to protect us during these battles and learn how to 'put on this spiritual armor and wear it daily.' God has supplied the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the shoes of the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God, and the covering of prayer. Until we learn what this armor is and why we need it, we will be defeated at every turn. But . . . with God, we will learn to protect ourselves through the tools and instruction He has provided in His Word.

Matt. 4:18-20 “As Jesus was walking beside to Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. “Come follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will make you fishers of men.” at once they left their nets and followed him.”

Imagine you being called by Jesus to leave your career and follow Him. What thoughts may have run through your mind? How am I to take care of my family? What things might I have to get in order before I leave? (pre-pay some bills, cut the lawn, water the garden and say good bye to family and friends) When Jesus calls us to a higher calling, we must trust that He has already considered all these things and has taken care of them.

Note that as Jesus was walking, Simon and Andrew were casting a net; they left it in the water and followed him. They didn't even take advantage of the last net full or the final days pay.


So what was it that was so convincing about this calling? The Bible doesn't tell us, so it is kind of left up to us to try and figure it out. Have you ever thought about this? I have and this is what I think.

We have come to think that fishermen in Jesus' time were poor and ignorant men. This was not the case. If we look at the verse in Acts 4:13 “When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled (ignorant) and ordinary men, they took note that these men were with Jesus.” This term unschooled probably has the meaning that these men had no theological training in the rabbinic schools. This fact may have caused them to feel shunned and insecure as Jewish men. When Jesus came and told them to follow him, they perhaps felt a chance to study under a Rabbi and be redeemed. This meant more to them than their livelihood and the life they were now living.

Like us who have not been theologically trained may feel inadequate, Jesus is also calling us to a higher calling, and just like for the early disciples he has all the details worked out. We just have to realize that He will give us the knowledge, boldness and words to say as well as the people to whom to speak them. He has already given us the authority, the great commission, and a testimony (our story).

God did not give us our story just so we could remember where and from what He has brought us out of, but also so we could share it the hope to others through it.

So get involved in spreading the Word that “God is Not Dead” and is still calling people into His kingdom.

Fishing for holiness

"Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime." (Unknown)
While it is unclear who was the author of this proverb, it will become clear why it describes "Christ's forgiveness", "imparted righteousness" and "living in the Spirit" perfectly. A sinful man, living in the flesh, needing forgiveness is like a hungry man needing food. Christ's death and resurrection provide forgiveness and impart righteousness in the believer.

There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus."

Romans 3:22-24(NIV) "This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus."

For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. 12 It teaches us to say "NO" to ungodliness and worldly passions and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age. (Titus 2:11-12)

Galatians 5:16 I say then: "Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh."

Christ's blood acts as white-out to sin but walking in the Spirit creates a holy life which does not need the white-out. *"So then, are we to say, "Let's keep on sinning so that there can be more grace"? 2 Heaven forbid! How can we, who have died to sin, still live in it?" (Rom. 6:1-2) cjb*

Jesus did not give us His Grace so that we can continue in our old ways and just receive forgiveness whenever we need it. He did not say it's ok, that we fall short. On the contrary, He spoke very strongly about sin in Matthew 18:9: *"And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast it from you."*

Real Grace that comes from God always has two aspects:

- 1) Forgiveness for sin
- 2) Change in behavior



Our love to God motivates us to walk righteously. 1 John 3: 3-8.

1 John 3:9 (NIV): "No one who is born of God will continue to sin, because God's seed remains in them; they cannot go on sinning, because they have been born of God."

However, since we are in this body and we still have the possibility to sin, there is the white-out available for the occasional wrongdoing. We have an Advocate with the Father in Jesus (1 John 2:1-2) who is faithful to forgive.

The goal is to walk in the Spirit and leave the flesh behind. The focus shifts from feeling condemned by sin to living in freedom, using the tools we've been given to walk in the Light with each other and the Father.

Ephesians 5:8 (NKJV): "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light."

Colossians 1:10 (NKJV): "That you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; "

Have fun going on a fishing trip with the Holy Spirit and praise God for the abundance of fish you will catch.

If there's one that got away, don't worry Jesus has your back!

CELEBRATING PASSOVER / EASTER / RESURRECTION SUNDAY
AND UNDERSTANDING THE JEWISH ROOTS OF CHRISTIANITY

At this holiest time of year in Christendom, how many Christians actually understand the Jewish roots of Christianity? Passover originated when the Israelites, in exile in Egypt, were instructed by the Angel of the Lord to paint their doorposts and lintels with the fresh blood of the lamb during the last plague put upon Egypt. This blood was to protect the Jewish people from the plague. This 'spotless lamb' from their flock is a sign of the coming Messiah, (EXODUS chapter 12). According to Jewish custom, all members of a family had to take part in the slaughter of the lamb. That meaning is significant in the New Testament as each and every person is guilty of the Lord's death; we are all sinners and all responsible. "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all," ISAIAH 53:6. Jesus, or Yeshua to the Messianic Jewish, was the fulfillment of that sign in the book of Exodus. (A Messianic Jew is one who recognizes Jesus Christ as the Messiah.) Jesus, born of the lineage of David (MATTHEW chapter 1), was Jewish, His lineage, priestly. Scripture states, 'Salvation is of the Jews,' (JOHN 4:22). Jesus identifies Himself as the Messiah in JOHN 4:25-26.

Jesus Christ fulfilled this sign in the New Testament as he was known as the 'Lamb of God' from the beginning of his ministry when John the Baptist saw Jesus and said, "...Behold the Lamb of God, which takes away the sin of the world," (JOHN 1:29). Christians celebrate Easter, and Resurrection Sunday, Messianic Jews the Passover and we celebrate the new life we have in Jesus Christ, the Messiah. Not all Jewish people recognize him as their Messiah. The Orthodox Jewish faith celebrates the Passover. Referred to as "the Lord's Passover," (EXODUS 12:11), the Israelites were told that they shall observe this [Passover] for an ordinance forever, (EXODUS 12:24,27).

Seven-hundred years after Isaiah prophesied about the coming Messiah (ISAIAH 9:6,7), Jesus was born. At the age of 30, Jesus' ministry began. After three years, "...Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders, chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and raised the third day," (MATTHEW 16:21). At the Passover meal, "Jesus took bread, and gave thanks, and broke it, and said to His disciples, 'This is My body, given for you: do this in remembrance of Me.' Likewise also the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you,'" (LUKE 22:19-20). Today, we celebrate the Lord's Supper in remembrance of his sacrifice.

At Passover, knowing he would soon be taken captive and crucified, Jesus and his disciples went to the mount of Olives. While praying, his agony was so great that 'His sweat became as great drops of blood,' (LUKE 22:44). Jesus, knowing that his death was near, in another passage said, "Now is My soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father save Me from this hour? But for this cause I was born," (JOHN 12:27; 18:37).

CELEBRATING PASSOVER / EASTER / RESURRECTION SUNDAY

We have absolutely no idea how much our Creator suffered for our sake, or how terribly he was tortured so that he could save us from our sin. Not just my sin and yours, but the world's sin: every sin of every individual who had ever lived or would ever live, was placed on Him – the sinless, spotless, Lamb of God. He died to redeem us from our sin. Jesus Christ, the Messiah – Yeshua Hammashea, loves each one of us unconditionally.

Scripture states that he was so bruised that he was unrecognizable as a man (ISAIAH 52:13-14). He knew from the foundation of the world (1 PETER 1:19-20) that he would be a sin-offering. Yet he came willingly to teach us how to live, love and give, and chose to die for us that we might choose to live for him. He's already done his part. Now it's up to us. Believing is a choice. What will we choose to do with Jesus Christ? The choice is ours. He's already made his decision.

This year, as we celebrate Passover, Easter, and Resurrection Sunday, let us never forget the price paid for us. The price was blood and the death of our Savior. Today we can celebrate. Because of His sacrifice, the victory is ours. He is risen, friends, He is risen indeed. †

Preparing for the wedding feast

I intended to run an article after Fran Barbano's article [Celebrating Passover/Easter](#), but when reflecting on it I found a flaw that makes the idea of The 7 Jewish feasts and their relationship to Biblical prophecy as presented on a website just not ring true.

The factual part of the teaching is the fulfillment of the Spring Feasts in Christ Jesus.

Passover fulfilled on the cross, Unleavened bread, the removal of leaven from our houses in the burial, leaven, symbolic of sin, being removed. John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (Jn. 1:29)

First Fruits in His resurrection. Have you ever wondered why Jesus said to Mary in John 20:17 **Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father, go instead to my brothers and tell them, I am ascending (present tense) to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God" (NIV)** The King James says do not touch me. Then in verse 27 He tells Thomas to put his finger in his nail scarred hand and to put his hand in His side. What changed? He had ascended to the Father being presented as the first to be resurrected, the fruit of Jesus' sacrifice. And finally, the feast of Weeks or Pentecost fulfilled on Pentecost.

The fall feasts are the Trumpet feast, Atonement feast and Tabernacle feast. According to an article on the internet (watch what you read on the internet even from teachers of the Bible, some are in error others are from cults who wish to deceive and confuse you.) it makes the case that the Rapture is to be on the feast of Trumpets. One point was that no one knows the day or hour when that feast takes place, within a 10-day window. It is on the full moon which changes from year to year.

To believe that the rapture or gathering up of the saints will occur during Rosh Hashana would lead people to only be ready from the end of August until mid-September. Then, they could go back to their "normal sinful, self-indulged" lives until the end of the next August. The error is in the timing, the fulfillment of the fall feasts will begin at the second coming not at the rapture.

Amir Tsarfati, a Jewish Christian teacher who alerted me to the error of the Trumpet Feast teaching Asked, wives on your wedding day did you wake up an hour before your wedding, run to the alter without brushing your hair and teeth? (Grooms wouldn't even do that, well most grooms.) No, the bride prepares herself long in advance for her bridegroom. The church, the bride of Christ needs to prepare and be ready for her Bridegroom, on that glorious day when the dead in Christ will rise up to meet Him in the air and then those who are not asleep. (I Thes. 4:16-18)

Mike: Yes. Yes, I think I need Jesus in my life.


