Colossians 3:15-16

1. How can the adults of Lockwood better help our young people to become committed and capable disciples of Christ? What happens if we neglect this responsibility?
2. Read *Colossians 3:15-16*. What does Paul mean by “the peace of Christ” in this verse? Have you ever witnessed, or been a part of, a disagreement between two believers where there was no peace? Was it resolved or not? What do you think St. Paul would have said to the people in that situation?
3. Can a Christian live at peace with God when they have hostility toward another believer? Will changing churches solve the problem?
4. What does it mean for the peace of Christ to “rule”? Do you think that the peace of Christ “ruled” at Lockwood when we went through Covid? What can we learn from that time? How can the peace of Christ rule among us in the upcoming political season?
5. Does the peace of Christ rule in your families? If not, why not? Are you seeking peace in all your relationships, as far as it depends on you?
6. How can Paul command us to be thankful? What helps you to be thankful when you are having a bad day?
7. Read *Colossians 3:16*. Someone said, “The peace of Christ rules where the word of Christ dwells.” Why is that true?
8. What is the word of Christ? How can we let it dwell in us and among us? How can it dwell among us “richly”?
9. What teachers and musicians have had the greatest influence on you and helped the word to dwell in you richly?
10. What should we pray from this passage for our church?
