As your Leadership Team, we want to thank you for all that you have done and continue to do. Throughout the year, your generosity was on full display, from many who faithfully volunteer on Sunday mornings to those who have willingly stepped up to serve our neighbors locally and globally with your time, treasure and talents.

As you pray and reflect, celebrate with us what God has done in your life, in the life of our church, and in our community this past year:

- River Life Covenant Church, est. 1999, celebrated our 26<sup>th</sup> year of faithful mission and ministry, of which the past twenty years have been at our A Street location.
- Even as long-time members and friends of River Life gather for worship, fellowship, and mission, each week we welcome new people who are finding new and renewed faith.
- Advent, Christmas Eve, and Holy Week celebrations of Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday to draw us into God's story of incarnation, sacrifice, and resurrection!
- In April, we hosted our third annual Chili Cook Off in which we saw three new finalists, with first place going to a vegetarian chili.
- In May, six River Lifers made the sojourn to Mission Springs in Scott's Valley for the PSWC Men's Retreat to commune with God and brothers in the redwood forest.
- Globally, five River Lifers went to Costa Rica in June to visit local churches and ministries, discerning how God might lead us into future partnerships. The exploratory trip was so successful, we hope to send around twenty people in the Summer 2026!
- Later that month, families and friends gathered for a movie and popcorn night.
- Fall Life Groups offered opportunities to meet beyond Sunday morning to pray, read, and grow together in faith and friendship.
- Our Alpha Course continues to be a space for friends and neighbors outside of the church to find community and explore questions about life, God, and faith.
- In September, we hosted a Miles for Refugees event with World Relief, to raise funds and awareness for refugees and other at risk immigrants. We also heard from World Relief rep Phillip Wiggins, exhorting us with Jesus's command to welcome the stranger.

- All year long, our Good Neighbor Team has walked alongside an Afghan refugee family, helping them move toward securing transportation, food, and educational opportunities. These weekly meetings have become much anticipated occasions of sweet laughter and meaningful connection.
- Our Fall Fest in October, in partnership with Wild Rose Montessori School, hosted dozens of children and their families in a flurry of fun around crafts, games, candy, treasure hunts, and a bounce house.
- That same weekend, eight youth and their leaders attended the PSWC High School Camp at Mission Springs.
- Wonderful staffing. We are grateful for the two years that Pastor Sara Fisher was with River Life as our Pastor of Family Ministries, and it was sad to see her go. We also give thanks for God's provision in the staffing transition, with both Katharine Oswald as our Interim Children Ministries Coordinator and Irene Siniy-Bailey as our new Associate Pastor. We also give thanks for Joe Poppino, our faithful worship leader.
- We contribute to, and benefit from, our strengthening relationship with our Covenant denomination. As a local church within the broader church, we join God in God's mission to see more disciples among more populations in a more caring and just world.
