Holy Week Worship: Thy Will Be Done

Throughout the season of Lent, our midweek worship services have focused on Jesus' prayer, *Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven*. We have explored how God's will affects every part of our lives: our inadequacy, our dreams, our identity, our worldview, and our response to the promise of God's love. Our Holy Week worship experiences bring to a crescendo God's will for our lives and the world.



Join us for the *Thy Will Be Done* Palm Sunday worship service on March 25th at 9:30 a.m. We are not always willing to do what God asks of us, but in his Palm Sunday entry into Jerusalem, Christ reveals to us that even tough roads are worth traversing for the good of the Kingdom.

On **Maundy Thursday** we remember that Christ asks his disciples to wash one another's feet, as he has washed theirs, for the joy that was set before him. Serving one another with joy is a tribute to him, the Servant of All. On **March 29th at 7:00 p.m.,** we share Holy Communion, joining Christ and the disciples at his Last Supper.

Our library is here to serve you and we appreciate the comments, suggestions, and questions we get from our users. If you are trying to locate a certain author or a particular book just ask or leave us a note in the return box. We'll do our best to find what you are looking for. Let us know if you really enjoyed a book or found one especially helpful. It gives us an idea of the kinds of books we should be adding to our collection.

Jan Karon's latest novel, To Be Where You Are takes us back home to Mitford with Father Tim Kavanagh and his family and friends. Although this is the fourteenth book in the series, the adventures and misadventures of life in Mitford are as entertaining as ever. The town is in a tizzy. There is the mis-matched picture to the obituary of one of the town's leading citizens, so which Esther is really deceased? The 89 year old former mayor is seriously considering throwing her hat in the ring yet again. Dooley and Lace have a major plumbing problem at the Meadowgate Farm vet clinic and plans are being made for a special "Naming Day" celebration when Jack Tyler officially becomes their son. Through it all Father Tim is doing what he does bestloving and caring for the citizens of his little town, Mitford.

The first book in Tracie Peterson and Kimberly Woodhouse's "The Heart of Alaska" series is In the Shadow of Denali. This fictional story ties into the factual account of the dedication of Mount McKinley National Park in 1923 by President Warren Harding. He actually stayed at the Curry Hotel during his visit. In the story, Cassidy Ivanoff and her father John are very much involved in the preparations for this historic event. Cassidy works as an assistant to the head cook at the hotel and John, having climbed Mt. McKinley (called Denali by the natives) several years earlier, serves as the wilderness guide for the hotel's tourists. Unfortunately during that climb a member of the climbing party died under questionable circumstances. The dead man's business partner quickly and convincingly pointed the finger of blame at John and although his preparations and procedures were meticulous, he does bear the burden of guilt. When Allan Brennan, the man's son, arrives in Curry seeking an explanation, Cassidy, in an effort to lift the burden of blame from her father, becomes an unlikely partner with Allan in getting to the bottom of what really happened. The combination of mystery and adventure with a bit of romance mixed in makes this a story you will stick with to the end.

Stop in and enjoy these new books and the many others in our library.
