The Amazing Acts of the Holy Spirit Small Group Study

September 26, 2021: Acts 2:38-47, 4:32-37 *Like Family (Or Closer!)*

What do you devote yourself to *daily?* Anything that would pass for a daily devotion?

On Pentecost, after the Holy Spirit gave the apostles the ability to speak in other languages about what God was doing, many gathered to hear Peter speak about Jesus. He finished his message by saying, "God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." The people were cut to the heart and asked what they should do. Read Acts 2:38-47.

How would you put Peter's answer in your own words to explain what it means to become a Christian? What is required? What is promised? To whom?

When has God given you power or courage to talk about Jesus?

Remembering where these 3000 come from, in what way is Acts 1:8 partially fulfilled here? What news will the people be bringing home with them?

What do these 3000 converts end up doing? How is God with them?

What made the early church so appealing to others? What is the closest you have come to experiencing the kind of close community described here in Acts? What keeps the church from experiencing this kind of fellowship now?

What aspect of life in the early church do you most desire for your congregation or group?

What needs do you have right now? How can this group pray for you?
