



ISAIAH 9:2

### **LET THERE BE LIGHT**

### by Pastor Andrew Potratz

How much impact does one small light have on the darkness? I remember learning about something called "absolute threshold" back in high school. It's a psychological term, and we learned it in the context of how our senses respond to stimuli. What stuck with me most was how that works with our sight.

The absolute threshold is the minimum intensity that a stimulus can be detected 50% of the time. So, your absolute threshold with vision would be something like a single candle from a mile away, or a distant star that you can barely make out on a clear summer night. You can tell that it's there, but that light isn't close enough to have a great impact on your ability to see in the darkness.

But what if you and the light are closer together? In terms of the stars, only one star is close enough to radically change our lives: the sun. Because of it, we have bright days, warmth, and growing things. The light is necessary for life. In terms of candles, that one candle at a mile away cannot help you find your keys, but if you move that candle into the same room as you, now you have a whole new experience of what that light is capable of.

How close are you? How close are you to the flame of the Gospel that we speak of carrying this year? How close are you to the "Light of the World" - Jesus? In our daily lives, we often observe matters of God and Faith at a distance. The missionaries are "over there" somewhere else and we hear stories about them. The pastor is "up front" while dozens of others sit away (sometimes at great distances!) as close to the back of the pews as possible. The youth come and fill the church on Wednesday nights, but only a few adults ever come into that space to experience what God is doing.

So, I ask again. How close are you to the light? Our world is full of great darkness. But God's Light is brighter, better, purer, and more enduring than any darkness that exists. Our proximity to the light matters. And as God relentlessly pursues you and me, how might our awareness and experience of the light grow if we do the same? The Light of Christ is your only ticket to abundant life. Without His light, you will never Thrive as God intended you to thrive. Think and pray about these things and see how the Holy Spirit might be speaking to you!

This Advent, our theme will be "Let There Be Light." The miracle of Christmas is one where God's great Light becomes flesh and moves into the same room as us. As we develop this metaphor (and impactful spiritual truth) through Advent and into the new year, may it help us to better understand and know the flame that we are called to carry as followers of Jesus!

I encourage you to get into the same room as that light. Let the "light of mankind" illuminate your hearts and minds. Let it give you warmth. Let it drive out the darkness in your life, so that you are better prepared to drive out the darkness in the world around us. Let there be light!

# What Can I Pray About?


- We pray that God would empower and sustain the ministry of Immanuel, it's members, it's leaders, and those that are blessed by Immanuel in our community.




# Puzzle!

- 6. On each leaf, write the name of one person or thing you're thankful for.
- 7. Punch a hole in each leaf.
- 8. Lace the leaves, beads, cereal, and pasta onto the yarn, ribbon, or raffia.
- 9. Tie the ends and hang your garland.
