

#### A Reminder from Pastor Chris...


**2019** will be the year of the Bible at First UMC! In January, we will begin a 3-month program called **The Bible in 90 days or B90!** We will read 12 pages a day of the Bible and in 3 months, we will have finished reading the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. There will be a Wednesday evening Bible Study to help us dig deeper into the massive amount of Scripture we will have read that week. Sunday's sermon text will be taken from that week's reading for the previous week.

## What in the world will we get out of reading the Bible so quickly?

We will get a bird's eye view of Scripture like we never have had before. We will find ourselves reading the prophecies about the coming Messiah and a week or two later, we will begin reading about Christ's birth! It is a lot of work but it is worth it! Reading plans will be available for those who wish to use their own Bibles for the program. Or, NIV large print Bibles are available with the daily reading marked out for you. There is a participant's guide to help you prepare for the discussion at the Bible study or to help you dig into your reading on your own. Be sure to stop by the office for a large-print NIV Bible already marked and to let us know that you will be participating in the B90 program.

NITED METHODIST WOMEN

The United Methodist Women have purchased and placed in the library on designated shelves several books on the 2018 Reading List. The focus of the UMW Reading Program points toward involvement in Christian mission in its many forms. Books are available in the church library for anyone and everyone to borrow and read. Your cooperation in signing the book out as you take it would be appreciated. Josie Cuffe recently read one of the books and has provided the following review:

## "The Golden Cage" by Shirin Ebadi (Nobel Peace Prize Laureate)

I have to admit that before reading this book I was largely ignorant of the politics involving Iran. I feel compelled to bring what information I gleaned to those who like me, want to be knowledgeable. I'm being as accurate as I possibly can as the history is complicated.

For 50 years, the Pavlavi dynasty ruled in Iran (1926-1956). Problems concerning the oil fields which had been signed over to a British man, William Knox D'Arcy, for a 20% interest for Iran by another Shah in 1901 was later to become a bone of contention. Reza Shah who took over in 1926 and his son Mohammad westernized Iran. When Reze was forced out because of his tacit approval of Hitler, Mohammad took over and almost immediately had a more open attitude. One of

the persons in government, Mossadegh Ambriothe, succeeded in voiding the pact with Britain concerning the old fields and immediately became very popular. He became Prime Minister, but the Shah dismissed him and, in an apparent coup, he was arrested and tried for treason. He died in prison in 1967. (In an apparent concession to the U.S. involvement, Madelline Albright later said the US had made a mistake and apologized to the Iranian people. Many said that had Mossadegh remained in power, his reforms would have forestalled the radicalization of the Shah's regime and prevented the Islamic Revolution.)

Mohammad and his father before him said that women were not to wear veils and had transferred judicial power from religious leaders to its pre-Islamic origins breaking with Sharia law. Other reforms involving redistribution of land were opposed by the clergy because they were large land holders. They also opposed the "army of knowledge" a group of young people the government sent out among the people teaching them how to read and write. This was work the clergy had normally done and, of course, they didn't like it because they could no longer be a major influence in religious ways on the people. Merchants didn't support the reforms either as they feared fiscal policies would ruin their businesses.

The growing influence of the Khomeini was even more pronounced after Black Friday in 1978 when the military shot into a demonstration. The Khomeini became the voice recognized as the voice against the Shah. Nationalists, communists and Islamists joined forces to protest for Iran. Gravely ill, the Shah left Iran in 1979. Khomeini returned and because of the weakness of the transitional government, he created an Islamic Republic. He became Supreme Leader. The new constitution put all power in the hands of a few. A decree was issued: the veil must be observed and polygamy legalized.

Like the Shah, arrests and torture were for those enemies who opposed them. When Ronald Reagan's Secretary of State shook hands with Saddam Hussain, it made the Iranians support the Islamic Revolution even more because Iran hated Iraq with whom they had had a war – and now the Satan US was supporting them.

The Revolution sought everyone who might in the slightest way have said anything against them and jailed and executed them. You were an enemy if you didn't praise the government even after the war ended. Writers were targeted. The mass executions of the early years were protested by the UN which sent in delegates to investigate, but in secrecy, they continued by tribunals or special operations teams headed by religious leaders. Well-known dissidents were killed, one that drew international attention in 1992. The religious leaders confiscated property of anyone they thought they could.

AGAINST THIS HISTORICAL BACKDROP IS THE STORY OF "THE GOLDEN CAGE". IT IS ABOUT AN IRANIAN FAMILY WITH 3 SONS WHO EACH WENT IN A DIFFERENT DIRECTION REGARDING THE GOVERNMENT and a daughter who became a peace prize recipient. IT IS A GRIPPING STORY, ONE THAT IS DIFFICULT TO PUT DOWN. The history is woven into her story and is more incidental than I have made it out to be. Because I knew nothing of Iran, I took notes but the story of the family is gut-wrenching and sad – incidents in our lifetimes that we in the US never have had to deal with.
