Dear FUMC friends,

When we presented our budget in January, it was mentioned that we were considering supporting a scholarship program through an organization called Art for Humanity which is based in Honduras. It sponsors children enabling them to go to elementary school. The children come from varied home situations so the sponsorship amounts differ. They start from as little as \$20 per month.

There are many ways we can help these children, we can sponsor a child as an individual, a family, Sunday school class, women's or men's group, or share the financial responsibility with a friend or coworker. If you choose to participate in this please understand that this will be a monthly commitment. I would also like to stress that this project is over and above our regular giving to missions NOT instead of it.

On Sunday, March 31st, Rev. Glenn Evans the director of Art for Humanity will be visiting our church and speaking to this very worthwhile cause. He will be able to explain the program and answer any questions you may have. There will be pictures of some of the children who need sponsorship on one of our bulletin boards. I would ask you to prayerfully consider getting involved in this project. Education is many times the springboard that enables children (and adults) to rise above their situations into a more meaningful and productive life. I do not think we could ever comprehend the value of a gift like this.
