EVENT OUTLINE

Materials Needed: Nametags, Markers for nametags, Scripture for Lectio (printed copies), 3 questions for post-it activity (printed copies), Post-Its (3 different colors & 1 pad per table), Large White Sticky Pad (3-5 sheets per event) and markers for that, ½ size blank white papers (enough for everyone to have one), Pens, Basket with handle

Room Set-Up: Round Tables is preferred with pens, 3 colors of post-its, ½ sheets, 3 questions, and scripture on the center of each table. A microphone can be helpful and a clear space to lead from up front. Wall space near the front for three large post-it sheets (write one question per sheet at the top)

Welcome & Prayer

Introduction

MOVEMENT I - Lectio Divina – Mark 6:34-44 (10 minutes x 2 + sharing = 35 minutes)

MOVEMENT II - Post-it Activity

- Introduction/directions & prayer for wisdom/discernment (18 minutes)
 - Color #1 Who Are We Now? (changing landscape, COVID, etc.)
 - Color #2 What Are We Called to Do? (God's abundance; What does it mean to be church today?)
 - Color #3 Who Is Our Neighbor? (We = ELCA Lutherans in Eastern North Dakota, including but not limited to your congregation)
- Each color/question has a "captain". Each captain collects their post-it's and reads them out, while arranging them on wall / large sheets
- Verbal sharing/reflections

MOVEMENT III – Most Essential

Invite people to partner up and each share ONE thing from the event that they consider most essential. Each person record on a $\frac{1}{4}$ sheet that is placed in a basket as they depart

CLOSING

- Info will be shared of your gathering & all gatherings compiled
- You could host something like this for your own congregation
- Information from the Baskets events will inform synod priorities in the coming years and are a part of a visioning process currently in process

Closing prayer
