Course Description

This course is designed to introduce students to the biblical and theological foundations and to provide an historical overview of Christian missions.

Student Learning Outcomes

By the end of the course, the student will

1. Demonstrate basic knowledge of the biblical and theological foundations of Christian missions;
2. Demonstrate basic knowledge of the history and practice of missions from the early church to the present; and
3. Demonstrate basic knowledge in developing awareness of missions and strategies for missions in the local church.

Course Texts

1. Johnson, Andy. *Missions: How the Local Church Goes Global*. Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2017.
2. The Bible (ESV, CSB, NASB, NKJV).

Course Requirements and Grading

1. The student is required to read the textbook and the book of Acts in the New Testament, according to the schedule in the course syllabus. Students should read the portion to be covered before coming to class. Students will submit the reading log on the last day of class to account for this reading.
2. Each student will commit to pray daily for unreached and unengaged people groups and for global Gospel missions using the website www.peoplegroups.org.
3. Each student will complete a 1-2 page reflection paper. The reflection paper may be typed or neatly handwritten. The reflection paper is due on the last day of class, and the paper must answer the questions below:
 - a. Are all Christians called to participate in the Great Commission? Why, or why not?
 - b. What do you believe is God's specific call in his mission in your life right now?
4. Each student will complete a final exam on the last day of class.
5. The final grade for the course will be determined as follows:

a. Reading Log	20%
b. Reflection Paper	30%
c. Final Exam	50%
