Go through the bulletin with your children and circle the things in which they might be interested (Children's time, hymns, helping with the offering). Mark the bulletin with symbols for when it is time to be quiet and listen, join in the hymn, read a prayer aloud, etc.

Busy Bags are available in the church entryway. Quite often, children can absorb what is going on in church if their hands are occupied and their minds do not have to focus so much on "behaving." It takes a great deal of energy and concentration for a child to stay quiet and still. Please use the busy bags to occupy their hands so they are free to listen. Nudge them when it is time for a hymn and ask them to sing along with you. Encourage them to come forward for the *Time for All Ages* and to participate in presenting the offering.

WORDS TO PONDER PREPARING FOR WORSHIP Rev. Dr. Cameron Trimble:

The solstice does not tell us that things will be easy. It tells us that limits exist—even for darkness. That systems bend before they heal. That the work of turning often happens without applause, certainty, or immediate reward... The invitation is not to rush toward light, but to live as people who understand how turning works—slowly, subtly, and with consequences that unfold over time. That kind of understanding does not make us passive. It makes us patient in the strongest sense of the word: capable of bearing what must be borne without surrendering to despair.

but his presence that saved them;




