A TIME FOR ALL AGES

LESSON FROM THE PROPHETS

Isaiah 58:1-9a

Shortly after the return of Israel from exile in Babylon, the people were troubled by the ineffectiveness of their fasts. God reminds them that outward observance is no substitute for genuine fasting that results in acts of justice, such as feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless and clothing the naked. Listen for the instructions for us today in the words of the prophet writing in Isaiah's name, chapter 58, verses 1-9a.

Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins. Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgments, they delight to draw near to God.

"Why do we fast, but you do not see? Why humble ourselves, but you do not notice?" Look, you serve your own interest on your fast day, and oppress all your workers. Look, you fast only to quarrel and to fight and to strike with a wicked fist. Such fasting as you do today will not make your voice heard on high. Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD?

Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am.

GOSPEL LESSON

Matthew 5:13-20

[Jesus said:] "You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled underfoot. "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called

TAKING THE LESSONS HOME

In 2002 the producer of BBC-London, Danny Wallace, gained a following when he issued an anonymous invitation in a London newspaper to “join him.” After hundreds of replies, the *Karma Army* was born. It is an online community commissioned to perform random acts of kindness every Friday, called “Good Fridays.” In ***Building a Discipling Culture***, Mike Breen and Steve Cockram reflect on the impact a Christian community could have if it made a similar pledge but for different reasons.

Discuss as a family this week what you might do as a random act of kindness this coming Friday. Bake cookies for a neighbor, pay for a family’s meal at a fast-food restaurant, bring a snack tray to a police station or fire department, volunteer to help with an activity time at a nursing home or bring a meal to someone just home from the hospital. Do you have an elderly neighbor who might need some simple home repairs completed or some help shoveling snow? You will come up with many more ideas than these. Then, think of a day and time each week when you can let your light shine in some way!
