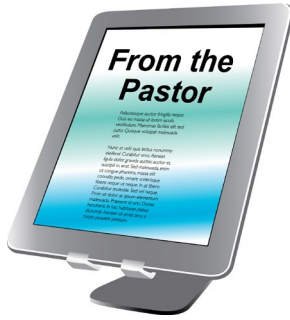

On the last Sunday of Easter, as we approached Pentecost, we learned that Jesus was and is praying for us. The fully human Jesus, facing his arrest and crucifixion, was praying for us. 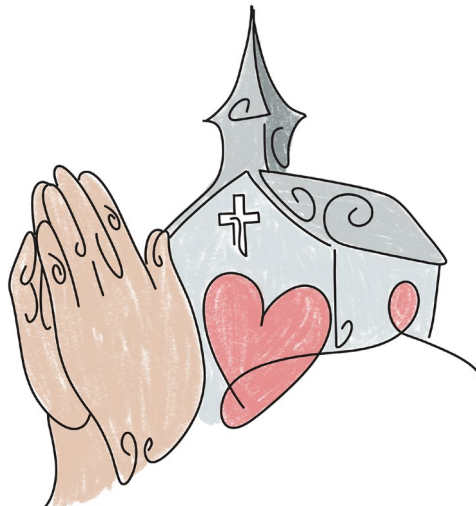

### Ask for Help



In April, Tracy Schlegel, Executive Director of NAMI Northwoods, and her husband, Mark, shared their lived experiences of mental health with the congregation.

Their story was inspiring and reminded me how the power of support, love, and friendship is amazing and can help us cope with and overcome challenges. Having awareness of resources available and the courage to use them as well as ask for support is critical too.

Sometimes it can feel difficult to reach out and ask for help. We think we should be able to "manage on our own." Some of us may feel that we do not want to bother anyone. Some of us may have learned that asking for help is a sign of weakness. I disagree. It takes strength and courage to lean on others.

Throughout the bible, God encourages us to ask for help. "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you." Matthew 7:7-8. The next time you feel "stuck," whether with how you are feeling or something you are doing, ask your family or friends for support. I bet they would be happy to help; I know mine are. 😊

## STEWARDSHIP CORNER



The book of Joel stands out among the minor prophets. While it carries familiar themes of warning, judgment, and hope, Joel never tells us exactly why a prophetic word is needed or what the people have done wrong. There is no named king, no historical moment pinpointed, no clear sin to blame.

Instead, Joel describes a locust plague. What begins as a natural disaster ripples outward into hunger, poverty, and despair. Joel’s message invites us to see not only this ancient tragedy but every place—near and far—where communities are brought low by disaster, violence, injustice, or exploitation.

In the face of uncertainty, destruction, and grief, Joel’s insight is strikingly simple: **God does not demand offerings the people do not have.**

Instead, the prophet calls them to offer themselves; he invites them into a communal reorientation toward compassion, solidarity, and shared commitment.

Perhaps you are part of a congregation in crisis. What would it look like for you to seek God and one another in honest lament, trusting that God can work through your shared care?

Perhaps you are part of a congregation with a wealth of resources. How might you be called into solidarity, recognizing that suffering is rarely felt equally and that God’s people are to notice, respond, and stand with those most affected?

Joel reminds us that God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and rich in steadfast love, while inviting us to trust that God’s mercy creates room for hope and a path to flourishing for all.

### Merrill E-Cycling Event



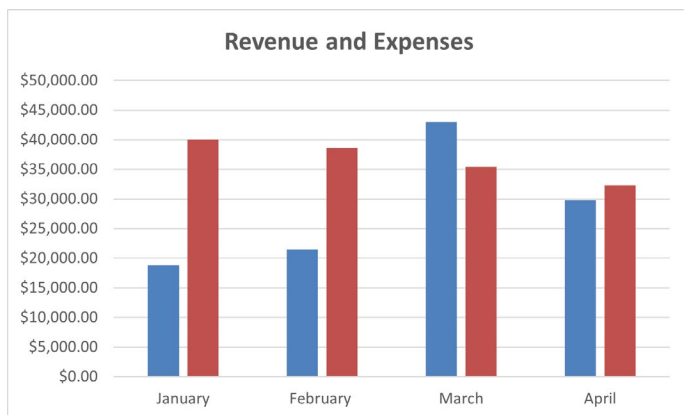

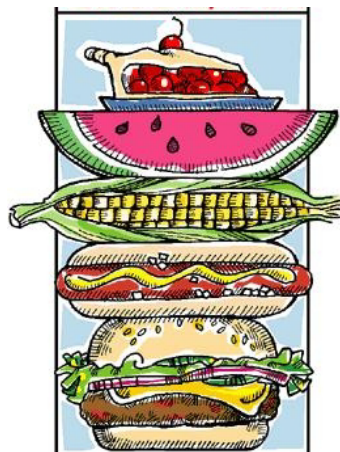
