Advent 2025



Benevolent Needs Discussed. Do we have any known benevolent needs inside of the congregation? Reviewed several needs for members that the Deacons have been assisting with or seeing if assistance would be helpful. Do we have any known benevolent needs outside of the congregation? No needs were discussed for members outside of Niekerk.

- e. Special Guest. Reinier Deblois shared about his involvement with Jerusalem Center for Bible Translation. The organization specializes in providing training and historical context for individuals that are actively working on translation efforts of the Old Testament. The present needs are related to funding scholarships for individuals that are unable to cover the full cost of the 4-month training session which is ~\$8k/student. At this time, the Deacons are looking for opportunities to inform/educate the congregation as it relates to this organization and their work and look to schedule some loose offerings in 2026 to provide financial support for this organization.
- f. Niekerk Family Mission Trip Fund. The 2026 Mission Trip is July 25-31. We will be working alongside First CRC of Grand Haven at ARO.
- g. Open Discussion, Correspondence and Other Items. Dale made the group aware that the Holland Deacons' Conference just received notice from Ottawa County Health Department that the funding they historically have received (\$250k) will not be continuing into the future. This will be a significant funding hit for the HDC and we will need to stay in communication with HDC in the coming months.
- h. Food Drive. Discussed an email recently received related to the concern of the government's SNAP funding being paused as the government is shut down and the desire to start collecting food resources for anticipated needs in the community. The Deacons will be seeking where food supplies collected could be best used in the community. We will be reaching out to the community impact group to see if they are aware of any organizations that have current/increased needs.

NIEKERK CHRISTIAN REFORMED CHURCH WEATHER POLICY and PROCESS Updated 3-13-20

- Whenever the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning for Ottawa County which extends
 past one hour before the stated beginning time of any scheduled church activity, that activity is
 cancelled.
- 2. Whenever the National Weather Service issues a tornado watch or any kind of severe thunderstorm alert for Ottawa County which extends past one hour before the stated beginning time of any scheduled church activity the Executive Committee* shall determine whether or not that activity is cancelled.
- 3. The Executive Committee* shall decide whether or not congregation-wide meetings and functions (e.g. Worship Services, Congregational meetings, and the like) shall be cancelled in situations of severe weather which have not produced National Weather Service alerts (e.g. heavy snow; fog; ice; and the like.)
- 4. Each group's leadership shall decide whether or not to cancel, postpone, and/or reschedule the activities and/or functions of their own groups. (e.g. Youth Group, Cadets; GEMS; Summer Bible Club: Hockey Rock, etc.)
- 5. Cancellation notices will be posted on the websites of local TV station: WOOD TV CHANNEL 8; WZZM CHANNEL 13; WWMT CHANNEL 3. A Prayer Line email message may also be sent.
- 6. Rescheduling of any church related function or event shall be arranged, if reasonably possible, so the postponed meeting or event is not rescheduled to conflict with already scheduled events.

*For purposes of this policy, the Executive Committee will be deemed to include the preaching pastor, President and Clerk of Council when determining the cancellation of a worship service.

This past week at Eagle's Nest Orphanage has been absolutely amazing. Coming in, I had no idea what to expect. However, God answered SO many prayers I prayed coming into this week.

The team I joined was a group of 7 girls (5 from Indiana, 2 from Ohio) and 1 guy (from Kansas). We were also blessed with Marissa (from Guatemala), our amazing translator, who was with us all day, every day. You never know what you are going to get with a group of people coming together but God was clearly at work. This team was wonderful to partner with. The leaders were strong, solid women of God, and the other team members came with open hearts ready to serve. Everyone was encouraging, welcoming, and easy-going. We had a great week together.

Throughout the days with the kids, we did a vacation Bible school (VBS), fall festival (face paint, balloon animals/swords, various games, etc.), movie & pizza night, piñatas, worship, and free-play time with the kids. As a team, we also had some time for rest/reflection, debriefs, testimonies, devotion sharing, and adventure times (new foods, markets, walks, etc.).

If you've ever worked with kids, you know you learn so much from them. This week I was reminded of the importance and POWER of childlike faith, purity in love, inclusion, the heart of worship, the beauty of diversity & language, the simplicity and power of inviting someone to be part of a game/conversation, and much more. These kids' resiliency, faith, ability to trust, and all-in love have marked by life.

I was also greatly blessed by a missionary named Julie. She caught me one night and asked how things were going and expressed she had been trying to find time to connect to talk more and answer any questions I may have. God provided a perfect time to do so. We talked for just under 2

hours about the ins and outs of the orphanage but were also able to simply talk about life, what God has spoken, and how I am doing with all of it. I didn't realize how much I needed that conversation and time with Julie, but I am so thankful for that time, her willingness to talk, and all the wisdom and truth she was able to speak into my life.

Again, I have no idea what God is doing big picture. But, again, I am even more excited for what is to come after this week. I feel torn because I could easily go back to Peru or Guatemala and do the same things I did and be more than content. However, I am truly resting confidently in knowing that God has a beautiful, perfect plan and knows the desires of my heart and what is best for me. I also am confident that He will continue to reveal next steps in His timing.

For now, I am heading back home after I spend a few days with a friend in Antigua, Guatemala. I will be taking up learning Spanish (if you have any pointers, let me know!) out of obedience to what I feel the Lord has asked me to do, and I will continue making connections and seeing where God leads. (: I will be posting pictures, but it will probably be in 2-3 weeks since I need to get most pictures from other people.

Thank you for your continued support as I navigate what God is doing and where He is leading me. I truly couldn't do it without you all. As always, I will keep you updated as I hear the Lord speak!

Greetings from Holland Deacons' Conference and Brothers and Sisters Homes! For nearly 45 years, HDC has been providing loving, Christian homes for individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities with the support of Christians who choose to invest in this ministry. One measure of the quality of these homes is evidenced by the number of residents who have lived there for over twenty years.

For the six years prior to 2025, HDC received money from the Ottawa County Mental Health Millage to help fund our programs. We recently learned that, due to some changes in need and priorities at CMH, HDC will not receive any millage support for 2025. This puts a \$200,000 hole in this year's budget and threatens the sustainability of our excellent programs into the future. The Sunday following the receipt of this disappointing news, my church sang "O Worship the King" and I could not help but think of BSH. Please read these lyrics with the residents of BSH in mind.

Greetings once again, Niekerk, from "Pastor Luis" about the Word and Deed Project that I have been involved with for years and you have been supportive of. Thanks.

I'm not good at getting pictures into my letters (sorry), and for two reasons I'm using larger than usual print font. One, to make it easier to read, and two, because in August I wrote a detailed explanation of changes made over the last two years. That had a lot of words; I hope you got through some of that.

Here I'll just say that I'd appreciate your looking at and reading the information on the adjoining page that outlines a "re-alignment" of how things now will go forward. This is a significant shift that I hope you can appreciate, it takes me out of a direct relationship with the El Salvador Christian Reformed Church. In turn, via a non-profit started years ago by CRCNA staff called "Seeds of New Creation," those churches will be more in relation with our denomination via Resonate Global Missions.

I'll be candid here; patterns don't change easily. Because of the long-standing personal relations, recently I have gotten informal reports from Pastor Carlos Mejia about the Project that Semillas and his Santa Tecla church are helping with in a newer area called Maria Victoria, about half an hour challenging walk from Huizucar. Trainings have taken place about violence in its various forms.

We have great concern over some Michigan lawmakers that have been trying to pass medical aid in dying legislation for years, most recently in the 2023-2024 session. At that time, the legislature considered an aid-in-dying bill, SB681, called the Michigan Death With Dignity Act. If it had passed, the law would have functioned much like Oregon's Death With Dignity Act, allowing terminally ill patients who met certain requirements to request and use life-ending medication.

How can you help?

~First and foremost <u>PRAYER!</u> Pray that God will remove the scales from the eyes of those who seek to destroy the unborn, to abolish parental rights, to devastate the lives of the women and men and their families, who have had abortions, jeopardize the health of women seeking abortions and those who do not value the aged and the infirmed.

Six Important Reasons

to Oppose Legalizing Physician-Assisted Suicide



Insurance companies will deny life-saving treatment

Stephanie Packer was told her insurance company wouldn't cover her life-saving treatment, but was instead offered assisted suicide drugs for a \$1.20 co-pay. Canadian officials estimated that euthanasia and assisted suicide reduce annual spending between \$34 million and \$138 million, versus the cost of lethal drugs being between \$1.5 million and \$14.8 million.



No screening for depression

Ruthie Poole experienced severe depression and could relate to the desire of a "painless and easy way out." In Oregon, only a dismal 3.3% of patients who have died by assisted suicide were referred for psychiatric evaluation.³



Life expectancy after terminal diagnosis unreliable

Jeanette Hall from Oregon was diagnosed with terminal cancer in 2000 and asked for assisted suicide. Her physician convinced her treatment could be beneficial, and she is alive today. A study of terminal prognosis accuracy found only 20% accurately predicted when death would occur.⁴ 1 in 8 hospice patients outlive the 6-month terminal prognosis window.⁵



Suicide contagion is real, targeting seniors and veterans

A Veterans Affairs Canada staffer brought up the topic of assisted suicide when one veteran sought assistance to treat his PTSD and traumatic brain injury.⁶ After Oregon legalized assisted suicide, suicides in the state increased twice as fast as national rates.⁷ In Oregon and in Switzerland, suicide comparative-studies have been conducted due to assisted-suicide being legal. Studies showed older adult women avoid suicide except when physician-approved.⁸



People with disabilities fear coercion and abuse

Stephanie Woodward fears assisted suicide for people with disabilities like herself: "Any doctor could prescribe a lethal dose and any person could administer that dose to kill a person, with medical confidentially preventing any oversight. No independent witness is required during the death of an individual, so there's no way to ensure that the individual administered the lethal dose himself or herself. In a world where abuse of people with abilities and seniors is rampant, this alone is cause for concern." ⁹



Proponents of assisted suicide quickly move to eliminate safeguards

Proponents tout "safeguards" and "guidelines" in assisted suicide legislation, but quickly move to eliminate them after legalization of PAS. These include reducing or eliminating: waiting periods, residency requirements, self-administration of lethal drugs (allowing euthanasia), and the requirement that the person has a terminal illness.
