Hi Niekerk family!

I wanted to give a quick update on my trip to Iquitos, Peru. Carol and I spent two and a half weeks in Iquitos. Our main ministries were relationship building, helping families start bodegas (little shops out of their homes), street and drug hole evangelism, prison ministry, providing medicine, partnering with The Safe House (men's rehab center), and helping at a couple children's programs.



Carol has been going to Iquitos for 30 years now, so she has built many beautiful relationships with the people there. A lot of our days looked like walking the streets and people who know Carol coming up to us or us going to them and checking in to see how they were doing. These conversations presented the needs that God had sent us to attend to. It was encouraging to see Carol carefully discern the line of being the hands and feet of Jesus and being "Santa Claus" in their eyes. She always pointed the conversation to God as provider, and we prayed with everyone. Carol quickly invited me into these moments of discernment and prayer.

The Safe House is Carol's favorite men's rehab in Iquitos. She knows many of the guys from first knowing them on the street. The guys love her. We went to hang out with them a few times at the house. We also went with them to the drug holes a few times to evangelize. These nights left me in awe of who our God is. Watching men freely worship the Lord and testify about what He has done in their lives on the streets where they were once bound in addiction in front of some of their closest friends was powerful.

One of the children's programs was held in a remote village across the Amazon and the other two were held in the roughest town, Belén. Any of the kids in these areas can come to these programs. They worship, pray, hear a short Bible story, do a fun activity, and then are blessed with a snack or meal. The goal of these programs is to disrupt and break the cycle of addiction, abuse, and poverty one child at a time through a relationship with Jesus.

We also did quite a bit of ministry with a gentleman named Jorge. Jorge was on the streets and in the drug holes for years and was also in prison before entering The Safe House where he had a radical encounter with God. We did drug hole evangelism and went to the prison with him. At the prison, we worshiped, testified, and handed out sandwiches and soda. Again, it is one of the most encouraging and powerful opportunities watching someone go back to the places and people that once held them bound in sin and shame and proclaim the name of Jesus.

Our time was full and short, but each encounter and conversation filled my cup to overflowing and reminded me of God's character. I have no idea what big picture the Lord is working on, but Peru has left me even more excited for whatever it is. Peru and the people there stole a piece of my heart and taught me new depths of unconditional love, intercession, joy, patience, hope, and much more I haven't even begun to process. Up next, Guatemala!

Dear Niekerk Family,

The wait is over. Almost a year and a half after we applied, we finally got Mohan's Green Card, adjusting his status from a tourist to that of a permanent resident. The days were filled with anxiety, but so many of you prayed with us and encouraged us during this period of waiting. We thank and praise God for his goodness. Thanks to all of you who prayed and shared our concerns through these days.

Now that we have a Green Card, we can think of travelling outside the country. Most likely, we will travel to India in the winter (2026) for a period of teaching, other ministries, attending to unfinished matters there, and of course visiting our dear friends and family at Presbyterian Theological Seminary. It won't be a long stay there as there are restrictions on how long one can be out of the US while a resident alien. It will be wonderful to meet some new students and re-visit the older ones. Above all, it will be a pleasure to teach face-to-face and discuss topics with the class. While we are thankful for the technical facilities that enable teaching from a distance, there is nothing like being able to stand in front of a class.

Meanwhile, we are already more than halfway through the first semester of the new academic year 2025-26. Mohan is teaching three courses this semester online. One of his goals is to write textbooks for all the theology courses taught at PTS so that students can have affordable and contextually-sensitive study material in front of them. New teachers also appreciate having a syllabus ready. Mohan was able to produce a new textbook this academic year on "Church and Sacraments." He is presently working on a book on the doctrine of last things. Judy keeps up with alumni and compiles the PTS prayer list for each month. (If you would like a copy, please let us know.)

The Lord blessed the Seminary with a good enrollment this year. Twenty-five new students have enrolled, bringing the total number of students to 89, making a full campus. They represent 17 states of India and three countries (India, Nepal, and Myanmar). It is an answer to prayer that students from Myanmar were able to get visas to study theology in India.

Things are going well on campus despite a heavy Monsoon season which is just coming to an end. There has been a lot of damage in the state due to flooding and landslides, but the PTS campus is safe so far. We praise God for that. - Protection of the Seminary from the attacks of radical groups who are against the Christian faith. Freedom for students and alumni to engage in ministry without fear.
- The Seminary very urgently needs a certain permit from the authorities. Please pray for this great need.
- Plans and provisions for our travel to India in the winter.
- Good health for both of us. Judy has been experiencing severe pains in her right leg, due to sciatica. She is going through physical therapy.
- Our family is now in four different countries USA, Canada, New Zealand (Maria is studying there for one year), and India. Please pray that we may be kept together and under God's protection.






