

THIS IS TO MY FATHER'S GLORY, THAT YOU BEAR MUCH FRUIT, SHOWING YOURSELVES TO BE MY DISCIPLES.

John 15:8

What's God up to? Have you ever asked it? When we face difficulties or uncertainties in our lives, the question arises: "What's this for, Lord? The same is true in the life of a congregation that seeks to faithfully serve the Lord in the face of uncertainty. It's been over a year since our pastor moved to take another call. Why hasn't the Lord sent us a new pastor yet? We lament that some from Niekerk have left to begin serving in other congregations. Why has an unsettledness settled on us, our denomination, and nation? What's God up to?

We believe that when we pray "Your kingdom come" we're asking that the Lord would rule us by His Word and Spirit in such a way that **more and more** we will submit to Him. We're praying that God will preserve His Church and make it grow. That the devil's work would be destroyed along with every force that revolts against God and every conspiracy against His holy Word. We keep on praying this until God's kingdom fully comes. (Heidelberg Catechism Q & A 123)

So, my friends, this is what God is up to all the time. Ruling us by His Word and Spirit, calling us to submit to Him more and more and God is always in the process of protecting, preserving and growing us.

Speaking of growth, My friend Matt and I had a conversation about a story Jesus told of a gardener who pleaded with the owner of an orchard to give an unfruitful fig tree one more year before cutting it down (*Luke 13:6-9*). The gardener in Jesus' story to spare the tree, said he would dig around it and fertilize it. Now, I thought the digging around was only to aerate the soil. Matt (whose business is landscaping) shared with me how it was more than just that. For an un-fruitful tree, the digging includes cutting into the roots. This cutting causes the tree to be stressed, and a stressed tree naturally produces more flowers. The opened roots give the fertilizer fresh avenues for aiding growth. When the tree is dug around and nourished in this way, it will produce more flowers and in turn more fruit.

It's what God does when he allows us to be shaken. When hard and difficult situations cut into our lives, it's as though our roots are laid bare. In times like that growth happens. We grow to realize what's really important and what we were created for. A renewed hunger for His Word develops, producing growth, maturity and fruitfulness.

How has God been working in your life? Have you felt the Gardener's tending? Know that Jesus' purpose is to bring us to maturity -- to make us increasingly fruit bearing disciples. In the passage, Jesus called those who were listening to repent. The time is short. God's Word calls us to turn from sin and grow to produce the fruit that rises out of that repentance: a deep love for God, a growing holiness, and renewed passion for Christ and service in His Kingdom.

After Matt and I talked, I had a deep sense of awe and a renewed love for this Master Gardener who has pleaded for me and is working in me to make me fruitful. It's that Gardener who said, "This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples." John 15:8

So, in this time, God is preparing Niekerk and He's preparing Niekerk's next Pastor and his family to be fully equipped to serve Him with joy for such a time as this. The changes we're experiencing and those that lie ahead may feel uncomfortable, but, like cutting into the root of a tree, their purpose is that we would grow in obedience and bear more fruit.





Dear Mr. and Mrs. Nyhof,

The abortion pill, our judicial system, and the Whitmer Administration stockpiling abortion pills under the guise of a "critical medical reserve"...The intersection of important issues in today's information overload can sometimes make our heads spin. But we must remain vigilant in our critical work to save lives in today's culture. (Keep reading!)

The Abortion Pill

Today, more than 60% of abortions are chemical abortions. That means women are taking the abortion pill at home and often alone. While abortion providers and advocates tell women it is safer than Tylenol, the facts are much more concerning. One in 10 women who take the abortion pill will have an adverse health event, and a stunning 40% of those will end up in a hospital emergency room. (Source: The Abortion Pill Harms Women, Ethics and Public Policy Center, April 28, 2025.)

We know the abortion pill is dangerous, so what is being done about it? More than 100 prolife organizations sent a letter to U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. and Food and Drug Administration Commissioner Dr. Martin Makary, asking for a thorough review of the safety protocols for the abortion pill, particularly in light of the Ethics and Public Policy Center study. Right to Life of Michigan was one of the many cosigners of this important letter, and we are hopeful that a thorough review will be forthcoming!

Our Judicial System

The Good News...Just a few weeks ago, the U.S. Fourth Circuit Court ruled that West Virginia could restrict access to the deadly abortion pill. This is great news and a win for the cause of life, helping to safeguard women and protect innocent unborn lives.

The Bad News...No sooner than Congress passes and President Trump signs a bill to stop taxpayer funding from flowing to Planned Parenthood, Planned Parenthood lobs a legal challenge. Sadly, at the time I write this letter to you, the activist courts are blocking the Trump Administration's one-year defunding of Big Abortion.

Unsurprisingly, Michigan's abortion-obsessed Attorney General Dana Nessel jumped on the bandwagon, joining the legal challenge to Trump's important defund provision.

Stockpiling Abortion Pills

In 2023, following the supply chain issues we experienced during COVID, the State of Michigan allocated taxpayer dollars to stockpile <u>critical</u> medications. This was done out of concern that people with serious medical conditions

(over)

wouldn't have access to their life-saving medications...or so we thought. Quietly, the Whitmer Administration – through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services – decided to stockpile the abortion pill under this provision!
