

Dear Rainsville First Family,

With so much news that causes us concern about the Coronavirus virus, we thought it would be good to use this opportunity to share with our church family what we do every week to keep our facilities as clean and disinfected as possible and what we can do in case of any issues that arise in the future.

As an expression of our love for one another, there are hugs, high fives, and handshakes given to one another when we gather. But as you know, beginning with the outbreak of flu in late fall, we normally just give "fist bumps" to reduce the spread of germs. Let's take it a step further, if you wish to have no physical contact with someone else during this unusual season, then just don't respond with a handshake, hug or even a "fist bump," and no one will be offended. Just speaking to one another in love with a warm smile or even a humble bow can be sufficient for this season, if you so desire.

While they are no confirmed cases of the virus in Alabama at this time, this is certainly a communicable disease - spread through coughing, sneezing, and some human contact. So, we want you to know what our custodial staff does here every week to prevent the spread of germs.

All surfaces on tables, doorknobs and bathroom surfaces are wiped with a Clorox disinfectant wipe every week (or after each use by a group). The floors are mopped with a disinfectant solution. Last fall, we added six Purell hand sanitizer stations throughout our building that has the strongest sanitizer Purell offers.

Also, we have a concentrated cleaner that is used in hospitals that we can use in a spray to disinfect, if the situation arises.

Our children's staff always communicates to parents concerning how to handle attendance at events with sick children. So, we say to everyone, if you are showing symptoms of the flu or any other communicable disease, and especially having fever, stay at home. And as always, take the precautions of washing hands and covering coughs wherever you are.

We remind you all of our worship services are streamed live on our web site and Facebook plus the archives of the services can also be found on the church's web site.
